SOUTH WALES POLICE AND TRADING STANDARDS UPDATE ON ENFORCING THE LICENSING ACT 2003

1. Background

- 1.1 Under the provisions of Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003 the chief officer of police for any police area in which a premises is situated is designated as a responsible authority. Local Authority Trading Standards Departments have also been appointed as responsible authorities. The Act provides responsible authorities with a number of rights, duties and powers including the right to be consulted by the licensing authority, the duty to make representations and objections and to enforce the requirements of the law.
- 1.2 The role of South Wales Police and the Consumer Protection Service in making representations and enforcing the law has been a major factor in reducing the harm, disorder and nuisance associated with the consumption of alcohol in Cardiff. Chief Inspector Steve Furnham and Mr Stephen Grey the Operational Manager (Fair Trading) of the Consumer Protection Division have been requested to make a presentation to the Committee to provide details for the information of members.

2. Achievability

This report contains no equality personnel or property implications.

3. Legal Implications

3.1 All decisions taken by or on behalf of the Council must (a) be within the legal powers of the Council; (b) comply with any procedural requirement imposed by law; (c) be within the powers of the body or person exercising powers on behalf of the Council; (d) be undertaken in accordance with the procedural requirements imposed by the Council eg. standing orders and financial regulations; (e) be fully and properly informed; (f) be properly motivated; (g) be taken having regard to the Council's fiduciary duty to its taxpayers; and (h) be reasonable and proper in all the circumstances.

4. Financial Implications.

The licensing service is financed from nationally set licence application fees. There are no financial implications arising directly from this report.

5. Recommendation

It is recommended that the presentations be considered.
