




Lamby Way Solar Farm

CARDIFF

- Initial operator pulled out due to Government Policy Change
- Re-scoping and market testing during spring
- Re-advertisement planned to include:
 - Direct feed to Lamby Way Depot
 - Other "private wire" arrangements
 - Overcapacity and storage options
 - Still significant market interest

Heritage Retrofit SBRI


The "problem"

- More than 30% of buildings in Wales are over 100 years old
- Mainstream retrofit sometimes conflicts with heritage protection

Response

• 30 applicants, 6 feasibility projects, 3 demonstrators















Portable Renewables SBRI

The "problem"

- Vacant and underused land
- Not enough renewable generation in cities
- Can energy be a temporary "meanwhile" use












•Groundwater volume = 28 Billion Litres at 12°C

Progress to Date





- Sensors and impact monitoring in 60 boreholes
- Grangetown Nursery School Heat pump
- 3D city scale geological mapping
- Second stage funding bid



Strategic Outcomes?



- Delivered or facilitated over 35MW of local renewable energy generation capacity which is contributing to a 16% renewable energy provision per head of population for the city, the fourth highest in the UK.
- Total of about £6m external grant funding over 3 years
 - **2,000 tonne** reduction in the CO2 emissions from the Council's operational estate in the last year.
- Latest DECC data 27% reduction in citywide per capita CO2 emissions (based on 2005 baseline) and a 20% reduction in citywide absolute CO2 emissions.


