Economy & Culture Scrutiny Committee: 11 January 2018

On behalf of the Economy & Culture Scrutiny Committee, please accept our thanks for attending our meeting to review the performance of libraries. Members have asked that I pass on our sincere thanks to all the staff involved in providing our library services, for their dedication and hard work. As you will have gathered from our comments at the meeting, Members are truly impressed and heartened by the breadth and depth of the services provided by libraries, reaching into communities, engaging those in need and ensuring libraries play their part in improving people's lives. I'd be grateful if you could please ensure that library staff are aware of our appreciation of their work.

In terms of the Welsh Public Library Standards, Members are pleased with the positive direction of travel over the last three years and note Nicola Pitman's assurances that the Council will meet the computer target (WPLSQ10) this year and that the issues with supply requests (WPLSQ12) have been addressed. Members believe that all the staff that work in libraries should be counted towards the indicator for the number of staff per capita (WPLSQ13) and support you in your representations on this to Welsh Government.

With regard to the Society of Chief Librarians Universal Offers, Members were pleased to hear officers acknowledge the importance that all staff based in hubs and libraries should complete dementia awareness training; we look forward to this being

put in place. Members were reassured to hear that this training explains the different types of dementia and the behaviours that result.

Several Members felt that ward councillors could play a more proactive role in promoting the Library Services offers, for example by encouraging schools to participate in the Summer Reading Challenge and by ensuring Community Councils receive details of services and events in nearby libraries. Members were pleased that officers responded positively to these suggestions. In order to start this process, Members would like to receive details of which libraries offer the following services: 3D printing, Raspberry Pi and coding clubs as well as regular services and planned events in libraries.

Finally, Members were pleased to note that there will be no reduction in mobile library services or library services overall and that neighbourhood librarians are able to arrange library service events in localities that do not have libraries or hubs.
