1. Application

- 1.1 An application for a Premises Licence Variation, has been received from B Browne & Co Ltd in respect of Pitch Bar & Eatery, 3 Mill Lane, Cardiff, CF10 1FL.
- 1.2 The current conditions attached to the Premises Licence:
 - (1) In respect of the following licensable activities:
 - 1. The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises.
 - 2. The provision of late night refreshment.
 - (2) Unless otherwise indicated the premises may be open to the public during the following hours and for any hours consequential to the non standard timings:

- (3) The premises are permitted to provide licensable activities during the following hours:
 - 1. The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises:

Monday to Saturday: 10:00 to 23:00

Sunday: 12:00 to 22:30 Good Friday: 12:00 to 22:30

Christmas Day: 12:00 to 15:00 & 19:00 to 22:30

2. Alcohol may be sold for one hour following the hours set out above and on Christmas Day, between 15:00 & 19:00 to persons taking table meals in the premises in a part of the premises usually set apart for the service of such persons

and for consumption by such persons in that part of the premises as an ancillary to his/her meal. For other purposes or in other parts of the premises the hours set out above shall continue to apply.

On New Year's Eve between the end of the permitted hours in the premises on New Year's Eve and the beginning of the permitted hours in the premises on the following day.

A period of 30 minutes is allowed at the end of each period for the consumption of alcohol on the premises.

3. The provision of late night refreshment:

Monday to Saturday: 23:00 to 03:00

1. 4 The following application for variation is now made.

To extend the hours permitted for the sale of alcohol as follows:

Monday to Sunday: 10:00 to 01:00

To extend the hours permitted for the provision of late night refreshment as follows:

Monday to Sunday: 23:00 to 01:30

To extend the opening hours as follows:

Monday to Sunday: 23:00 to 01:30

2. Promotion of Licensing Objectives.

2.1 The additional conditions proposed by the applicant to meet the licensing objectives are attached to the report.

3. Relevant Representations

4. Legal Considerations.

- All decisions taken by the Sub-Committee must (a) be within the legal powers of the Council and its Committees; (b) comply with any procedural requirement imposed by law; (c) be undertaken in accordance with the procedural requirements imposed by the Council eg. standing orders and financial regulations; (d) be fully and properly informed; (e) be properly motivated; (f) be taken having regard to the Council's fiduciary duty to its taxpayers; and (g) be reasonable and proper in all the circumstances.

Manage and run a safe restaurant where people can enjoy food and drink until late into the night, using my fifteen years hospitality experience and management team, work & communicate with local Police and functions to ensure everyone have a safe and responsible experience in my venue and Cardiff as a whole. at least 75% of the licensable area will be laid out with tables and chairs for the purpose of eating and drinking, food will be available at all times alcohol is offered for sale.
b) The prevention of crime and disorder
Use of CCTV monitoring, vigilance by myself and license holders running shifts, not running immoral drinks deals or offers, use of plastic containers or major event days a cctv system will be installed to a standard agreed with South Wales Police. The system will cover all licensable areas to which the public have access, (excluding toilets) all entrances and exits and any outside areas used by customers. Images will be stored for at least 31 days and will be produced to an authorised member of south Wales Police upon demand when the premises are open to the public and within a reasonable period at all other times. There will be sufficient staff training to facilitate the above"
c) Public safety
On major event days all drinks will be dispensed in plastic vessels with the exception of hot drinks. There may be up to 12 extensions of hours for licensable activities (with the exception of TENS) each year. The management will submit a written operating schedule to South Wales Police at least seven days prior to such an extension. The Police will have an absolute veto over such extensions.
d) The prevention of public nuisance

You will receive notification of the date of the Licensing Sub-Committee hearing once the consultation period has ended.


