## 1. Application

- 1.1 An application for a Premises Licence Grant, has been received from The Grazing Shed Limited in respect of The Grazing Shed, 37 St Mary Street, Cardiff, CF10 1AD.
- 1.2 The applicant has applied for the following:
  - (1) In respect of the following licensable activities:

1. The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises.

(2) Description of Premises (as stated by applicant):

"The premises will be a gournet burger restaurant. It is situated on St Mary Street. We will have a fridge behind the till selling locally brewed ale and cider for restaurant consumption only with a meal."

(3) Unless otherwise indicated the premises may be open to the public during the following hours and for any hours consequential to the non standard timings:

Monday to Sunday: 07:00 to 23:00

(4) To provide licensable activities during the following hours:

1. The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises:

Monday to Sunday: 10:00 to 22:30

## 2. <u>Promotion of Licensing Objectives.</u>

We will work closely with the surrounding business' to prevent any crime and disorder. Fire escape routes and fire prevention will be implemented. At all times, one member of Staff on site will have Health & Safety training. We will not serve alcohol to anyone under the age of 18 even if they are 16 and eating a meal with an adult. If anyone attempts to purchase alcohol that we believe are under age will be refused and a written log will be taken of the attempt. The premises licence shall only remian in force as long as the principle use is that of a restaurant.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

A CCTV system shall be installed to a standard agreed with South Wales Police. It will be maintained and operated at all times the premises are open to the public. The system shall cover all areas to which the public have access (excluding toilets). Images shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days. The images shall be produced to a Police employee or authorised Officer of Cardiff Council Licensing in a readily playable format immediately upon request when the premises are open and at all other times as soon as reasonably practical. There will be sufficient staff training to facilitate the above. Alcohol will only be sold ancillary to the purchase of food.

## c) Public safety

We will work closely with the Building Regulation Officer to ensure all aspects of public safety is taken into consideration. This includes and is not exclusive to ad equate fire escape routes, emergency lighting, fire extinguishers, fireproof ceilings and walls, disabled access. The business is restaurant serving all age groups during the day. On major event days all drinks will be sold in none glass vessels.

#### d) The prevention of public nuisance

There is residential property around the premises therefore clear prominent, clear and legible signage will be placed at all exits requesting that patrons leave the premises and surrounding area quietly. We will also ensure that any noise is kept to an acceptable level and local business' and residents are not unreasonably disturbed. The use of any outside area will be by seated customers only. The outside area will be designated by ropes or planters.

e) The protection of children from harm

We will advise all members of staff to be on guard for any children at risk. We will not serve alcohol to anyone under the age

of 18 even if they are 16 or over, and eating a meal with an adult. Anyone attempts to purchase alcohol that we believe to be under 18 will be refused and a written log will be taken of the attempt. The same applies if an adult attempts to buy a drink for a young person over 16 (and under 18)





I, Chief Inspector Dan Howe, of the South Wales Police, herby give notice that an objection shall be made to the application for a new premises licence for We love Italy, 1-3 Royal Arcade, St Marys Street, Cardiff.

This Police objection is based upon the licensing objectives:-

- 1. The prevention of crime and disorder. (The premises are situated in an area which has high incidents of crime and disorder and incidents associated with alcohol)
- 2. The prevention of public nuisance (The premises are situated in an area which have incidents of public nuisance)

As a result the premises are located within the agreed Saturation Policy area for St Marys Street. (Special Policy Statement in respect of City Road and Crwys Road adopted 24 July 2009)

South Wales Police will object to the application to allow a Licensing Committee the opportunity to undertake the rebuttable presumption that the premises licence will not be granted unless the applicant can demonstrate that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives

Within the current application, the applicant has detailed the steps they intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives. These are in the way of voluntary conditions that would be placed on the premises licence

If the applicant successfully challenges the Saturation Policy or is able to demonstrate that the premises are likely to promote the licensing objectives, I feel that these conditions do not adequately promote the four licensing objectives, in particular the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance.

For that reason I have identified conditions that are necessary and proportionate that would enable the premises to operate whilst reducing the negative impact it will have on the licensing objectives.

However, I feel that it is pertinent to take this opportunity to reinforce the point that these conditions will not adequately promote the licensing objectives but merely go some way in limiting the extent as to which they are likely to be undermined.

- 2. This licence shall only authorise the sale of alcohol whilst the purpose of the premises remains for the operation of a restaurant/café.
- 3. At least 70% of the public space within the licensed area of the premises shall be occupied by tables and chairs.
- A CCTV system be installed to an agreed standard as approved by South Wales Police and maintained and operated at all times when the premises are open to the public.

The system will cover all internal areas of the premises where the public have access (excluding toilets), including all entrances and exits and any external area associated with the premises.

The images will be kept for a minimum period of 31 days.

The images will be produced to a police employee in a readily playable format immediately upon request when the premises are open to the public and at all other times as soon as reasonably practicable.

There will be sufficient trained staff to facilitate the above.

CCTV signage will be placed in prominent positions inside and outside the premises.

5. The premises will operate the 'Challenge 25' Policy. This policy will be brought to customers' attention through the display of appropriate signage. Challenge 25 notices will be displayed in prominent positions throughout the premises. The only form of identification recognised will be photographic identification cards, such as driving licence, passport or proof of age scheme (PASS) card.

- 6. All staff will be fully trained before they are authorised to sell alcohol and will be refresher trained on a regular basis, with records kept on the training, retraining and initial authorisation and re-authorisation.
- 7. On days considered to be major events in the City and Cardiff Bay area, such as sporting events or pop concerts in the Millennium Stadium, all drinks shall be dispensed in non-glass or plastic drinking vessels. The exception to this will be if persons are seated at tables and partaking of a substantial table meal.
- 8. An incident book shall be kept at the premises and maintained on site at all times. It shall be made available on request to an authorised officer of the local authority or a member of police staff, which will record the following: All crimes reported to the venue Any complaints received (of a Criminal or Licensing nature) Any incidents of disorder Any refusal of the sale of alcohol Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

The planning permission allowing for the use of the premises as an A1/A3 unit is subject to the following conditions:

No member of the public shall be admitted to or allowed to remain on the premises outside of the hours of 09:00 to 21:00 Monday to Saturday or outside of the hours of 10:00 to 18:00 on Sundays. Reason: To accord with the development as applied for, and to ensure for the amenities of occupiers of properties nearby.

The premises shall be used only for the purposes described in the application and for no other purpose whatsoever. Reason: Planning permission is granted on the basis of the characteristics of the sui-generis use proposed, other uses may have the potential to detract from the amenities of the area.

We would object to the granting of a licence on the basis that the max term hour exceeds the opening hours restriction on the planning permission, the opening of the premises beyond this hour could impact upon the amenity of neighbouring occupiers, therefore, resulting in a public nuisance. The applicant should also be made aware that the premises must operate as an A1/A2 mixed use.


