1. Application

1.1 An application for a Premises Licence - Grant, has been received from Kentucky Fried Chicken (GB) Limited in respect of KFC (Excelsior Road), Excelsior Road, Cardiff, CF14 3AT .

1.2 The applicant has applied for the following:

(1) In respect of the following licensable activities:

1) The provision of late night refreshment.

(2) Description of Premises (as stated by applicant):

“A well established KFC drive through restaurant with customer seating, service counter, drive through window and vehicle lane.”

(3) Unless otherwise indicated the premises may be open to the public during the following hours and for any hours consequential to the non standard timings:

24 hours, 7 days a week.

(4) To provide licensable activities during the following hours:

1) The provision of late night refreshment: 23:00 to 05:00

2. Promotion of Licensing Objectives.

2.1 The additional conditions proposed by the applicant to meet the licensing objectives are attached to the report.

3. Relevant Representations

Representations have been received in respect of the application, copies of which are enclosed with the report.

4. Legal Considerations.

4.1 In respect of the application the decision must be taken following consideration of the representations received with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:

Prevention of crime and disorder
Public Safety
Prevention of Public Nuisance
Protection of Children from Harm

4.2 In each case the Sub-Committee may make the following determination

- a) To grant the application.
- b) To modify the conditions of the licence, by altering, omitting or adding to them, where relevant.
- c) Reject the whole or part of the application.

4.3 All decisions taken by the Sub-Committee must (a) be within the legal powers of the Council and its Committees; (b) comply with any procedural requirement imposed by law; (c) be undertaken in accordance with the procedural requirements imposed by the Council eg. standing orders and financial regulations; (d) be fully and properly informed; (e) be properly motivated; (f) be taken having regard to the Council's fiduciary duty to its taxpayers; and (g) be reasonable and proper in all the circumstances.


(The omission of providing cctv images to the Police immediately upon request in the offered condition places a burden on the Police and the Crown Prosecution Service.

Interviews of detained suspects will be unnecessarily delayed. Charging decisions from the CPS will also be delayed. This will have a negative effect on the four licensing objectives.)

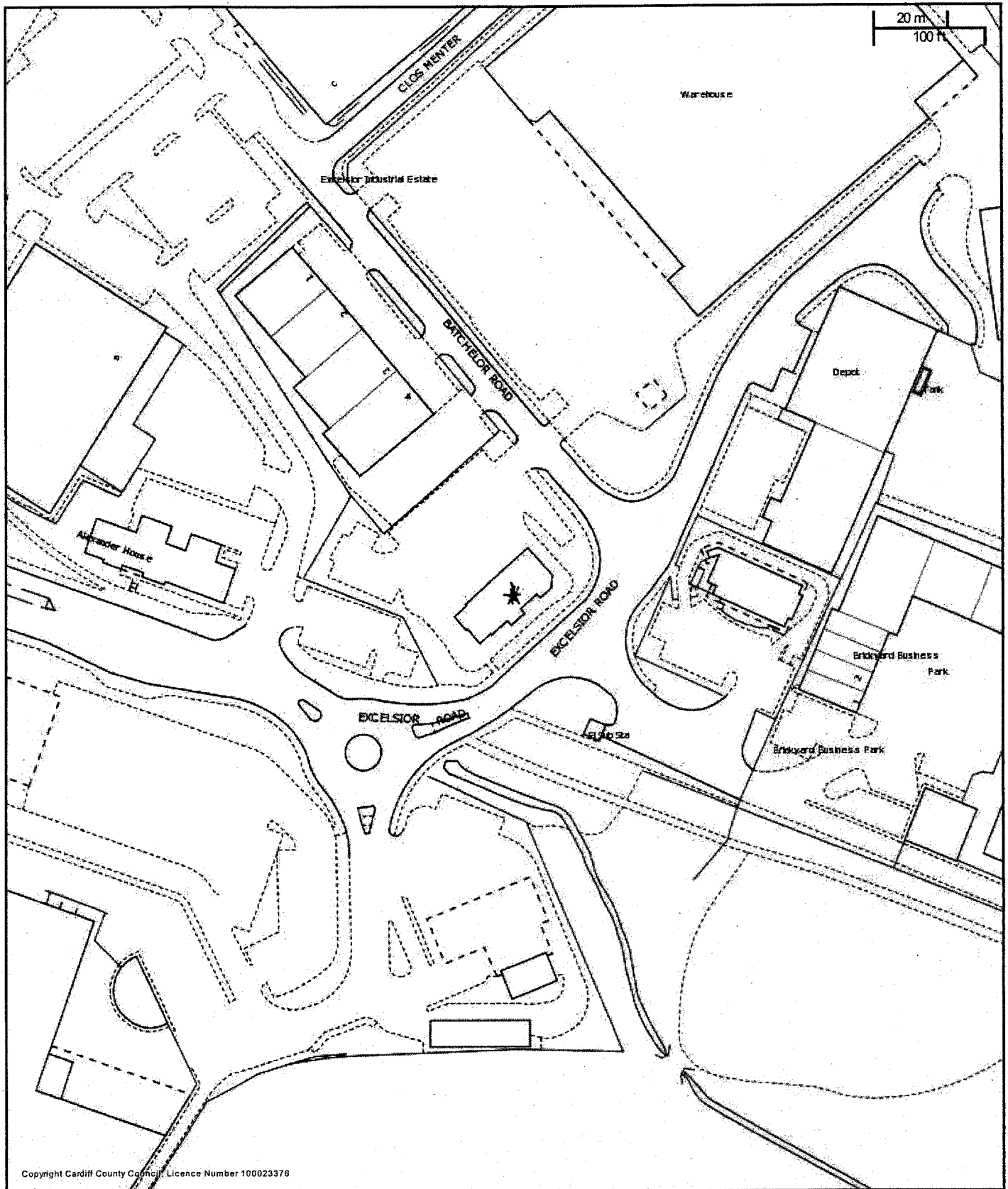
