1. Application

- 1.1 An application for a Premises Licence Grant, has been received from Vintage Tea & Coffee Co Ltd in respect of Unit 2-6, Castle Arcade, High Street, Cardiff, CF10 1BU.
- 1.2 The applicant has applied for a Premises Licence for the above premises and has given the description of the premises as follows:

"Juice bar by day including coffee, healthy juices, cocktails, wine, gin etc. Cocktail bar by night offering complimentary tapas/small plates".

- 1.3 The following licensable activity is proposed:
 - 1. The provision of live music: Monday to Saturday 18:00 to 23:00 Sunday 18:00 to 22:00
 - 2. The provision of recorded music: Monday to Saturday 08:00 to 02:00 Sunday 10:00 to 23:00
 - 3. The provision of late night refreshment: Monday to Saturday 23:00 to 02:00
 - 4. The supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises: Monday to Saturday 10:00 to 02:00 Sunday 10:30 to 23:00

2. Promotion of Licensing Objectives.

2.1 The additional conditions proposed by the applicant to meet the licensing objectives are attached to the report.

3. Relevant Representations

Representations have been received in respect of the application, copies of which are enclosed with the report.

4. <u>Legal Considerations.</u>

4.1 In respect of the application the decision must be taken following consideration of the representations received with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:

Prevention of crime and disorder Public Safety Prevention of Public Nuisance Protection of Children from Harm

- 4.2 In each case the Sub-Committee may make the following determination

 - c) Reject the whole or part of the application.

<u>APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE</u> <u>UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 2003.</u>

Vintage Tea and Coffee Co Limited, Unit 2 - 6 Castle Arcade, High Street, Cardiff

I, Chief Inspector Mark Hobrough, of the South Wales Police, herby give notice that an objection shall be made to the application for a new premises licence for Vintage Tea and Coffee Co Limited, Unit 2-6 Castle Arcade, High Street, Cardiff.

This Police objection is based upon the licensing objectives:-

- 1. The prevention of crime and disorder. (The premises are situated in an area which has high incidents of crime and disorder and incidents associated with alcohol)
- 2. The prevention of public nuisance (The premises are situated in an area which have incidents of public nuisance)

As a result the premises are located within the agreed Cumulative Impact Policy area for Cardiff City Centre as per the City of Cardiff Council Statement of Licensing Policy 2016-2021.

South Wales Police will object to the application to allow a Licensing Committee the opportunity to undertake the rebuttable presumption that the premises licence will not be granted unless the applicant can demonstrate that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives.

Within the current application, the applicant has detailed the steps they intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives. These are in the way of voluntary conditions that would be placed on the premises licence

If the applicant successfully challenges the Saturation Policy or is able to demonstrate that the premises are likely to promote the licensing objectives, I feel that these conditions do not adequately promote the four licensing objectives, in particular the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance.

For that reason I have identified conditions that are necessary and proportionate that would enable the premises to operate whilst reducing the negative impact it will have on the licensing objectives.

However, I feel that it is pertinent to take this opportunity to reinforce the point that these conditions will not adequately promote the licensing objectives but merely go some way in limiting the extent as to which they are likely to be undermined.

Police Representations

The Provision of recorded music Monday to Saturday 08.00 – 01.00 Sunday 10.00 – 23.00

The provision of late night refreshment Monday to Saturday 23.00 – 01.00

The Supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises Monday to Saturday 10.00-01.00 Sunday 10.30-23.00

1. A CCTV system be installed to an agreed standard as approved by South Wales Police and maintained and operated at all times when the premises are open to the public.

The system will cover all internal areas of the premises where the public have access (excluding toilets), including all entrances and exits and any external area associated with the premises.

The images will be kept for a minimum period of 31 days.

A copy must be provided in a readily playable format to South Wales Police employees should it be requested within 24 hours of the request.

There will be sufficient trained staff to facilitate the above.

CCTV signage will be placed in prominent positions inside and outside the premises.

- 2. The premises will operate the 'Challenge 25 Policy. This policy will be brought to customers' attention through the display of appropriate signage. Challenge 25 notices will be displayed in prominent positions throughout the premises. The only form of identification recognised will be photographic identification cards, such as driving licence, passport or proof of age scheme (PASS) card.
- 3. All staff will be fully trained before they are authorised to sell alcohol and will be refresher trained on a regular basis, with records kept on the training, retraining and initial authorisation and re-authorisation.
- 4. SIA registered door staff to be on duty at the premises from 19.00 hours on Friday and Saturday until close.
- 5. On days classified as 'major event days' by South Wales Police, SIA registered door staff to be on duty from open until close.

- 6. On days classified as 'major event days' by South Wales Police, all drinks will be dispensed into plastic vessels, with the exception being hot drinks.
- 7. An incident book shall be kept at the premises and maintained on site at all times. It shall be made available on request to an authorised officer of the local authority or a member of police staff, which will record the following:

All crimes reported to the venue

Any complaints received (of a Criminal or Licensing nature)

Any incidents of disorder

Any refusal of the sale of alcohol

Any refusal of entry

Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service

- 8. No performance of striptease, lap dancing, entertainment or a sexual nature of other similar entertainment will be permitted on the premises
- 9. Children under the age of 16 shall not be permitted to enter the premises after 22.00 hours.
- 10. An incident book shall be kept at the premises and maintained on site at all times. It shall be made available on request to an authorised officer of the local authority or a member of police staff, which will record the following:

All crimes reported to the venue

Any complaints received (of a Criminal or Licensing nature)

Any incidents of disorder

Any refusal of the sale of alcohol

Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

- 11. Open containers of alcohol shall not be removed from the premises save for consumption in any delineated external area.
- 12. In the delineated outside area only the consumption of alcohol is permitted...
- 13. The premises will operate a South Wales Police approved radio system.
- 14. The premises will be a member of the Licensee Forum for Cardiff City Centre or other related scheme (where one exists)

I write in respect of the above application submitted to the authority on 31st May 2017, and hereby give notification that the Licensing Authority of Cardiff Council object to the application for a Premises Licence.

A Cumulative impact Policy has been adopted for the City Centre area of the City. The Licensing Authority has adopted the policy due to high levels of alcohol related crime and disorder, in the interests of public safety and the avoidance of nuisance.

The policy creates a presumption that new applications for Premises Licences will be refused unless the applicant can demonstrate the business will have no negative effect on any of the licensing objectives. I have attached a copy of the policy for your information.

The premises detailed above falls within the boundary of the Cumulative Impact Zone and therefore an objection is submitted in respect to the following Licensing Objectives.

The prevention of crime and disorder. The prevention of public nuisance. Public safety.

Consequently the Licensing Sub-Committee will need consider this application.

However the Authority will withdraw its objection if the applicant can demonstrate that the premises is primarily a restaurant in that alcohol is only sold with a substantial table meal and there is no public bar area exclusively for the sale the sale of alcohol, in line with Cardiff Councils Cumulative Impact Policy.

You will need to demonstrate to the Licensing Sub-Committee that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives if the Premises Licence were to be granted.

You will receive notification of the date of the Licensing Sub-Committee hearing once the consultation period has ended.
