Application for Premises Licence - Grant

1. Application

- 1.1 An application for a Premises Licence Grant, has been received from Beelzebub Bars Ltd in respect of 31 High Street, Cardiff, CF10 1PU.
- 1.2 The applicant has applied for the following:
 - (1) In respect of the following licensable activities:
 - 1. The supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises
 - 2. The provision of late night refreshment
 - (2) Description of Premises (as stated by applicant):
 - "Traditional pub style bar focusing on craft beers, traditional ciders and home cooked foods".
 - (3) Unless otherwise indicated the premises may be open to the public during the following hours and for any hours consequential to the non-standard timings:

Monday to Sunday: 10:00 to 00:30

- (4) To provide licensable activities during the following hours:
 - 1. The supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises: Monday to Sunday 10:00 to 00:00
 - 2. The provision of late night refreshment (indoors): Monday to Sunday 23:00 to 00:30

2. Promotion of Licensing Objectives.

2.1 The additional conditions proposed by the applicant to meet the licensing objectives are attached to the report.

3. Relevant Representations

Representations have been received in respect of the application, copies of which are enclosed with the report.

4. Legal Considerations.

4.1 In respect of the application the decision must be taken following consideration of the representations received with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:

Prevention of crime and disorder Public Safety Prevention of Public Nuisance Protection of Children from Harm

- 4.2 In each case the Sub-Committee may make the following determination
 - a) To grant the application.
 - b) To modify the conditions of the licence, by altering, omitting or adding to them, where relevant.
 - c) Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 4.3 All decisions taken by the Sub-Committee must (a) be within the legal powers of the Council and its Committees; (b) comply with any procedural requirement imposed by law; (c) be undertaken in accordance with the procedural requirements imposed by the Council eg. standing orders and financial regulations; (d) be fully and properly informed; (e) be properly motivated; (f) be taken having regard to the Council's fiduciary duty to its taxpayers; and (g) be reasonable and proper in all the circumstances.

5. Issues for Discussion.

5.1 The application should be determined and the appropriateness of any conditions on the licence needs to be discussed.

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

The nature of the premises shall be a traditional pub/bar that offers craft beers and traditional ciders that emphasises quality and not quantity.
b) The prevention of crime and disorder
A CCTV system will be installed to a standard agreement with South Wales Police. The system should cover all licensable areas to which the public have access including all exits and entrances (excluding toilets) and any outside area used by customers. Images will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and produced in a readily playable format to authorised member of the police and authorised members of Cardiff Council. The images will be produced immediately upon request when the premises are open and within a reasonable time at all other times. There will be sufficient staff training to facilitate the above.
On major event days all drinks will be served in non-glass vessels.
On major event days SIA registered Door Staff will be employed at the premises throughout opening hours.
Door staff will be employed on a ration of 1 per 100 customers from 21:00 hours should the premises serve alcohol beyond 00:00.
Door Staff will be employed at all other times on a risk based management assessment.
c) Public safety
Fire Risk assessment will be carried out and kept on the premises at all times.
All kitchen staff will have relevant training in Food Allergens and Food Hygiene.
The food safety policy will be created in unison with local Environmental Health Officers to ensure full compliance and understanding of local regulations.
d) The prevention of public nuisance
Any use of the outside area is to be in accordance with the terms and conditions of Cardiff Council's pavement licenses.
e) The protection of children from harm
No entertainment of a sexual nature.

The log will hold records of at least one year and must be made available to authorised members of South Wales Police upon request.

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2. A record of door staff employed at the premises shall be kept. It shall keep a record of the name and SIA number of such staff. It will detain the date and time each member of staff commenced their duty and the time they finished.

The record will hold details for at least one year and be made available to authorised members of South Wales Police upon request.
