### 7 : APPLICATION FOR THE GRANT OF A PREMISES LICENCE - CHUNKY CHICKEN

Applicant: Mr Nassar Barnwell

#### The Application

An application for the grant of a Premises Licence was received from CDF Chicken Ltd in respect of Chunky Chicken, 230 City Road, Cardiff.

The applicant applied for the following:

(1) In respect of the following licensable activities:

The provision of late night refreshment (indoors)

(2) Unless otherwise indicated the premises may be open to the public during the following hours and for any hours consequential to the non-standard timings:

Monday to Sunday: 09:00 to 02:00

(3) To provide licensable activities during the following hours:

The provision of late night refreshment (indoors)  
Monday to Sunday 23:00 to 02:00

#### Applicants Representations

Mr Barnwell addressed the Sub Committee. Members were advised that when taking over the business in November 2017 Mr Barnwell was unaware that the premises did not have a premises licence to permit the sale of Late Night Refreshment. Following a visit from South Wales Police Licensing Officers, Mr Barnwell was now looking to rectify this.

The applicant accepted all the conditions set out in the representations received from South Wales Police. Mr Barnwell stated that he has consulted South Wales Police and is looking to be a good, well-respected, operator.

Addressing the 4 letters of objection received, Mr Barnwell advised that there are no residents in the flat above the premises or in the properties to either side of the premises. The validity of a number of the representations were questioned. The

telephone number listed are invalid and, furthermore, one of the persons listed is a customer of the business. That person has indicated that they did not object to the application and had not objected. Another objector was not resident at the address listed but he was a landlord.

Mr Barnwell considered that he was approachable and he would seek to address any concerns brought to his attention. The extraction system at the premises was serviced annually. There was only one report of crime and disorder at the premises in the previous 6 years – and that was the result of a break-in at the premises.

Mr Barnwell listed that steps taken to address the licensing objectives, including CCTV, staff training, the use of an incident book and the public safety measures in place.

RESOLVED – That the Sub-Committee having considered all the information and in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003, the Section 182 Guidance and the Licensing Authority's own Statement of Licensing Policy the Sub-Committee approved the application.
