2. Promotion of Licensing Objectives.

I have caused enquiries to be made into this application. The premises is an existing business and is located at High Street in Cardiff. POLICE REPRESENTATIONS.

In addition to the above conditions offered by the applicant, the Police make the following representations, made to support the following licensing objectives;

Prevention of Crime and Disorder;

1.SIA registered door supervisors will be employed at the premises on Fridays, Saturdays and those Sundays immediately prior to Bank Holidays, from 21:00hrs until the premises closes. They will be a minimum of two door supervisors at the premises at any one time on these days.

2.On those days designated by South Wales Police as major event days in the City Centre and Bay areas of Cardiff, SIA registered door supervisors will be employed {with a minimum of two door supervisors at any one time} at the premises from either 4pm that day or no less than two hours before the commencement of the event, whichever is earlier, until closure of the premises.

3. When SIA registered door supervisors are employed at the premises they will utilise at least one body worn video device. Any such device will be capable of recording both audio recordings and visual

images. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and will be produced to a Police employee in a readily available format immediately upon request when the premises are open and at all other times as soon as reasonably practicable. There will be sufficient trained staff to facilitate the above.

4.A register of door supervisors shall be kept at the premises. The Register shall show the full name and SIA registration number of each door supervisor, stating the start and end duty times from each door supervisor. The Register shall be kept by the DPS for a minimum of 12 months and will be made available to a Police employee or representative of a Responsible Authority on request;

The premises is situated on High Street occupying the ground floor of a premises situated within the Castle Arcade and High Street. Without accredited doorstaff, reliance is placed upon Bar staff and management to interact with persons and require them to leave if necessary. The Police submit that suitably accredited personnal should be employed on those days of the week when this is most likely to be required and on those days when the area is at it's busiest. In addition the Police request that thise door staff are suitably equipped with Body Worn Video devices to allow best evidence to be captured should such incidents arise.

5. When door supervisors are employed at the premises, the premises will utilise an electronic counting device (or provide two clicker-type counting machines) for monitoring the number of patrons entering and leaving the premises.

The use of such devices promotes public safety and contributes towards the prevention of crime and disorder in ensuring patrons have room to move freely around the venue without customers colliding with each other.

6.Open containers of alcohol shall not be removed from the premises save for consumption in any delineated external area.

Ensures that the premises maintains control of alcohol sold by them.

7. The premises will operate a South Wales Police approved radio system.

This is requested to promote and uphold the Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

8. The premises will be a member of the Licensee Forum for Cardiff City Centre.

This condition promotes and upholds the Prevention of Crime and Disoder in that it ensures that the premises receives information pertinent to the managing of the premises in relation to Major event days within the city centre.

Application to vary the Premises Licence – Coffee Barker, 1-13 Castle Arcade, Cardiff

Concerning the above application for variation of premises license, I wish to advise that the Licensing Authority of Cardiff Council will be objecting to the application.

A Cumulative impact Policy has been adopted for the City Centre area of Cardiff. The Licensing Authority has adopted the policy due to high levels of alcohol related crime and disorder, in the interests of public safety and the avoidance of nuisance.

The policy creates a presumption that new applications or variations for Premises Licences will be refused unless the applicant can demonstrate the business will have no negative effect on any of the licensing objectives.

The premises detailed above falls within the boundary of the Cumulative Impact Zone and therefore an objection is submitted in respect to the following Licensing Objectives.

The prevention of crime and disorder. The prevention of public nuisance.

There has been some detail in the application on how the promotion of the licensing objectives will be undertaken, however the premises falls under the category restaurant in the Statement of licensing Policy. For which additional steps within Table 2 of the Policy highlight measures that can be adopted by the applicant in order to achieve the policies objectives. It can be seen that the application details some of the additional steps within the operating schedule, however not all additional measures have yet been adopted and as such the application falls under the red category and the CIP still applies, Consequently the Licensing Sub-Committee will need consider this application in line with Cardiff Councils Cumulative Impact Policy.

You will need to demonstrate to the Licensing Sub-Committee that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives if the Premises Licence were to be granted.

Dear Sir/Madam,

As discussed with Kirstie Barker of your team this morning I would like to confirm my opinion on the application to vary the licence for Coffee Barker.

This department has had several noise complaints from the occupants of Flat 3, Castle Chambers about loud music from Coffee Barker. Flat 3 is located directly above the premises. After considerable involvement with all parties the occupants of Flat 3 were moved out and the Flat has been rented by the proprietors of Coffee Barker. I have concerns that there may be a recurrence of noise complaints should the current rental agreement over Flat 3 not continue.

In order to overcome these concerns I have suggested to the applicant that a condition be added to the licence that requires a noise limiter be fitted to Coffee Barker, the levels of which will be set so as not to cause a problem in Flat 3. The proposed wording for this condition is:

"All regulated entertainment in the form of recorded and live music must be played through a noise limiting device. The limiter must be set to a level agreed by the local authority's pollution control department who will ensure that the music will not cause a public nuisance".

I have been in contact with Mrs Barker, the applicant and we have agreed that this proposed wording is acceptable (please see the email chain below).

With this in mind, I would like to offer a no comment to this licence on the understanding that the proposed wording for the condition mentioned above is incorporated into the premises licence.

I hope this is acceptable.



(The above five conditions seek to prevent disruption to residents and other persons in the vicinity of the premises late at night.)

6. A cctv system shall be installed to a standard agreed with South Wales Police. The system shall be maintained and operated at all times the premises are open to the public. The system shall cover all parts of the licensable areas to which the public have access (excluding toilets) and all exits and entrances used by customers. Images shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days.

The images shall be produced to a Police employee immediately upon request when the premises are open and at all other times as soon as is reasonably practical. There will be sufficient staff training to facilitate the above.

(The Police acknowledge that the applicant has offered a cctv condition, the above wording sets out exactly what is required of such a condition with the avoidance of doubt and is deemed more appropriate in the upholding of the prevention of crime and disorder).

I wish to object to this application for a premises licence under the "Prevention of Public Nuisance" objective.

The proposal involves the provision of regulated entertainment (live and recorded music) until 02:30 on Fridays and Saturdays.

Please give further details of <u>why</u> you believe this application will have an adverse effect on the licensing objectives:

I believe there is the potential for the licensing objective "Prevention of Public Nuisance" not to be met for the following reasons:

I am concerned that allowing the premises to provide live and recorded music up to 02:30 would cause an unreasonable noise disturbance to local residents, which by my estimation numbers approximately 75 properties within a radius of 50m, including, three flats immediately adjacent to the premises.

Looking at other licensed premises that are in the vicinity of 155, Cowbridge Road East shows that regulated entertainment ceases at midnight (King's Castle, Time & Beef & The Italian Way). Allowing this premises to have regulated entertainment until 02:30 would not be in keeping with the other licensed premises in the area.

I am also concerned about the potential noise from patrons congregating and smoking in the street and it's impact upon local residents up to 02:30. This is likely to result in unreasonable disturbance to many of the local residents
