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	Following the Grenfell Towers tragedy, Cardiff Council tested the cladding on its' domestic high-rise blocks of flats and took the decision to remove it. A phased approach was taken for the re-cladding of these blocks. Phase 1 – Lydstep Flats is currently at the construction stage, and it is now the intention to move to Phase 2 – Nelson House / Loudoun House. Consultants were engaged to develop design options for the Council to consider. The option considered the safest in respect of fire safety was to move forward with the brick option, and this is the option that was approved for phase 1 (Lydsetp Flats). The same option is proposed for Nelson House / Loudoun House. It is proposed that this strategy is extended as its principles are still relevant but that a refreshed Delivery Plan is put in place to set out how Cardiff will delivery the aims of the Strategy.
