1. Application

- 1.1 An application for the Grant of a Premises Licence has been received from Bodega (Lakeside) Ltd in respect of Bodega, Unit 3, Amber Vista, Clearwater Way, Cyncoed, Cardiff, CF23 6DL.
- 1.2 The applicant has applied for the following:
 - (1) In respect of the following licensable activities:
 - (i) The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises.
 - (ii) The provision of late night refreshment (indoors and outdoors).
 - (2) Description of Premises (as stated by applicant):

"Ground floor A3 site that is part of a mixed use commercial/resi block. Approx 32 internal plus 36 external good weather covers located within walled developement. Site located in Lakeside area between Cyncoed Road and Roath Park Lake. On and off licence requested".

Unless otherwise indicated the premises may be open to the public during the following hours and for any hours consequential to the non-standard timings:

Monday to Sunday: 09:00 to 22:30 hours New Years Eve: 09:00 to 01:00 hours

- (4) To provide licensable activities during the following hours:
 - (i) The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises:

Monday to Sunday: 12:00 to 22:30 hours New Years Eve: 12:00 to 01:00 hours

(ii) The provision of late night refreshment (indoors and outdoors):

New Years Eve: 23:00 to 01:00 hours

1.3 A site map showing the premises and a plan of the premises submitted with the application can be found in *Appendix A*.

2. <u>Promotion of Licensing Objectives</u>

2.1 The additional conditions proposed by the applicant to meet the licensing objectives are attached to the report and can be found in *Appendix B*.

3. Relevant Representations

- 3.1 A representation has been received from South Wales Police. The conditions proposed in this representation have been agreed by the applicant. Copies of the representation and the subsequent agreement can be found in *Appendix C*.
- 3.2 A representation has been received from Pollution Control with proposed licence conditions. These conditions have been agreed and the representation has been withdrawn. A copy of the representation and subsequent agreement can be found in *Appendix D*.
- 3.3 A representation has been received from a local resident. A copy of the representation can be found in *Appendix E*.

4. <u>Legal Considerations</u>

4.1 In respect of the application the decision must be taken following consideration of the representations received with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:

Prevention of crime and disorder Public Safety Prevention of Public Nuisance Protection of Children from Harm

- 4.2 In each case the Sub-Committee may make the following determination

 - c) Reject the whole or part of the application.
- All decisions taken by the Sub-Committee must (a) be within the legal powers of the Council and its Committees; (b) comply with any procedural requirement imposed by law; (c) be undertaken in accordance with the procedural requirements imposed by the Council e.g. standing orders and financial regulations; (d) be fully and properly informed; (e) be properly motivated; (f) be taken having regard to the Council's fiduciary duty to its taxpayers; and (g) be reasonable and proper in all the circumstances.





LICENSING OBJECTIVES

Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

List here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.

There will be sufficient competent staff on site during opening hours.

Required training will be provided and updated regularly.

Senior team members will have appropriate qualifications by a recognized body.

All staff will be advised of licensing law in writing before they are allowed to serve alcohol.

With the support of our Health and Safety advisor, Fire Safety advisor and Environmental Health Officer risk assessments will be carried out. We will implement and maintain all required policies.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

We will install a CCTV system that will cover indoor and outdoor areas even when premises are not in use.

A notice will be displayed at the entrance to the premises advising that CCTV is in operation.

Bottles and glasses will be collected from the outdoor and public areas.

Glass bins won't be accessible for the public.

All instances of crime and disorder that may happen on the premises will be reported to the local police department.

On request CCTV footage will always be provided to the police.

c) Public safety

Health and safety assessments will be carried out and reviewed annually. Copy of all risk assessments to be kept at the premises.

Health and safety policy will be prepared by Chappell Safety Services Ltd.

Suitable fire risk assessment will be carried out, and will implement all necessary control measures.

Capacity to avoid overcrowding will be set for the premises followed by fire risk assessment.

Required weekly, monthly, six monthly and annual tests will be carried and records kept on site in suitable log book.

All portable fire fighting equipment and fire alarm system will be maintained and tested by a qualified technician.

Adequate and appropriate first aid kits to be available at premises.

At least one suitable trained first aider will be on duty when the public are present.

All required electrical testing will be carried our by a certified electrician. test results will be kept at premises. Annual inspections and testing will be in place. Electrical installation report will also be at the premises.

Gas safety certificate will be on premises and annual inspection will be carried out.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

There will only be background music playing in the restaurant during opening times, levels will be regulated to ensure that this is not disturbing any local residents.

During the final hours of opening the music level will be reduced.

Disposal of empty bottles into waste bins outside the premises will not be permitted between the hours of 22:00 and 07:00. All ventilation and extract systems are designed and maintained so as to prevent noxius smells causing nuisance to nearby properties.

All external lighting is direct away from residential properties.

Staff will undertake a litter pick around the premises.

e) The protection of children from harm
Children are only allowed on the premises with supervision of an adult or parent. The licensee and staff will ask persons who appear to be under the age of 25 for photographic ID to prove their age.

POLICE REPRESENTATION

- 1. A cctv system shall be installed to a standard agreed with South Wales Police. The system shall be maintained and operated at all times the premises are open to the public. The system shall cover all parts of the areas to which the public have access (excluding toilets) and all entrances and exits including any outside area used by customers. Images shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days. The images shall be produced to a Police employee immediately upon request when the premises are open and at all other times as soon as is reasonably practical. There will be sufficient staff training to facilitate the above.
- 2. At least 75% of the internal area used by customers will be laid out with tables and chairs for the purpose of eating and drinking.

Ordinarily customers will be seated.

- 3. There will be no outside bar.
- 4. An incident and refusals log will be kept at the premises. This may be either electronic or written. The log will contain details of all incidents of disorder and breakdowns of the cctv system. The log will be made available for inspection by the police upon reasonable request.
- 5. Use of the outside area by customers will cease by 2100 hours each day. From 2100 hours to opening the next day, all outside furniture such as tables and chairs will be roped, barriered or removed so as to prevent people utilising these tables and chairs.
- 6. Delivery drivers and riders employed to collect food and drink will gain access to the premises via the rear door. They will not be allowed to congregate at the front of the premises.

- 7. An age verification system shall be in place to verify that all off sales and deliveries of alcohol are made by persons aged 18 years or over.
- 8. An age verification system, such as Challenge 25, shall be in place to ensure that at the point of delivery alcohol is only handed to customers aged 18 years or older.
- 9. Orders will only be dispatched to a bone fide address; no deliveries will be made to open spaces.
- 10. Details of all orders for alcohol will be kept either electronically or in a register. The details will include the date of purchase, the nature and quantity of alcohol, who makes the delivery and who the alcohol is delivered to. The register shall be made available to the Police upon request.

If the applicant does not agree with the afore-mentioned representations the Police objections will be based on the following:-

The prevention of crime and disorder.


The protection of children from harm.

Re: Opposition to the Proposed Establishment of Bodega (Lakeside) Limited Ltd in Our Residential Locale

I am writing to express my objection to the proposed establishment of Bodega (Lakeside) Limited Ltd within our residential area, specifically at Amber Vista, Clearwater Way, Cyncoed, Cardiff, CF23 6DZ. While I genuinely appreciate the significance of local businesses and their cultural value, I firmly believe that this particular location is entirely unsuitable for such an enterprise, given several compelling reasons. . Noise Disruption: Our residential area is renowned for its tranquil and peaceful atmosphere, a primary reason many of us chose to call it home. The operation of such a business, particularly during late hours, would inevitably result in elevated noise levels. This disruption would disturb our quality of life and potentially cause discomfort to families, the elderly, and young children residing nearby [527]. Ensuring the safety of children in the area must be a top priority for all involved. Parking Predicament: Our neighborhood already grapples with limited parking spaces. The addition of such an establishment could exacerbate this issue, making it exceedingly challenging for residents, myself included, to find parking near our homes, Impact on Property Values: The presence of such a business could negatively impact property values within the vicinity. Prospective buyers and renters may be deterred by the noise and safety concerns associated with residing in proximity to such an establishment. I earnestly beseech the Cardiff Council to carefully consider these objections during the evaluation of the SOLT proposal. Preserving the serenity, safety, and character of our residential area should remain a paramount concern. Exploring alternative locations more suited for such a business is imperative to ensure the well-being and contentment of all residents. I kindly request that you keep me apprised of any further developments and decisions regarding this matter. Your attention to this crucial issue is greatly appreciated.
