GAMBLING ACT 2005 – SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES 2009/2010

1. Background

This report has been prepared to provide summarised details for the information of the Licensing Committee on the work undertaken in respect of the Gambling Act 2005 by the Licensing Service during the year from 1 April 2009 to 31 March 2010.

2. <u>Gambling Act 2005 Premises Licences.</u>

2.1 The Gambling Act 2005 was implemented during the year 2007/08 with a transition period being from 30 April 2007 to 31 August 2007. From then all premises licences within Cardiff had to obtain a licence from the authority. The number of licences held is detailed in the following table.

- 2.2 During the year 15 applications were received. Four applications where for the grant of a licence, 3 for variation, 2 for transfer, 1 for reinstatement and 2 for the issue of a duplicate licence. Two applications were withdraw by the applicant prior to determination. During the year one premises Riva Bingo surrendered its licence.
- 2.3 Nineteen Premises Inspections were carried out by Licensing Enforcement Officers. Six of the premises had satisfactory inspections with the remainder having technical discrepancies which were subsequently corrected.

3. Permits and Registrations.

2.4 The Gambling Act 2005 has also transferred the responsibility from Magistrates to Licensing Authorities in respect of the receipt of notifications and consideration of a number of different permits. During the year 76 notifications and applications were received from alcohol licensed premises, 52 premises notified the authority that they would be providing one or two gaming machines in their premises and 24 applications were received in respect of Gaming Machine Permits to permit the use of more than

three machines. Fifteen applications were received from Registered Members Clubs 14 for the issue of Club Gaming Machine Permits and one for a Club Gaming Permit. The following table provides details of the numbers of permits held.
