# ONE PLANET: KEY PROGRESS



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## Report Rationale:

- Formalises the One Planet Agenda as a key delivery mechanism for the “Greener, Fairer, Stronger - City Recovery and Renewal Strategy”.
- Reports back on the key outcomes of the public consultation;
- Describes the substantial progress made by Council
- Seeks cabinet approval of ‘direction of travel’ of key projects, and policy interventions that move this agenda onwards;
- Seeks delegation for selecting initial in year capital spend.

2. **Council's operations to be Carbon Neutral by 2030**  
**Carbon Neutral City by 2030.**
3. **Final Report Summer/Autumn 2020 – to include Carbon Modelling**



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## ONE: Public Consultation / Engagement

1. An online consultation - general public;
2. An online questionnaire - local businesses and organisations;
3. A bespoke survey of young people, designed/analysed by Cardiff's Youth Council, and
4. An Environmental Scrutiny exercise where key experts and stakeholders were invited to give their views on the draft strategy.

**Over 2000 responses**



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# Consultation: Key Results



- Climate emergency response needs to be resourced
- Consultation, engagement, leadership and partnership all crucial
- Critical to effectively involve public / stakeholder groups
- A leadership board essential
- Any final action plan needs to identify the projects that can be realistically delivered + timetable, costs and prioritisation
- Public behaviour change is the biggest challenge - needs to be well resourced, and continually in collaboration with partners longterm



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Consultation: The top 3 for each of the key consultee groups were as follows:

**Public survey:**

1. Energy - demand reduction and increased renewable generation
2. Green Infrastructure & Biodiversity
3. Transport – especially active travel

**Young people:**

1. Energy - demand reduction, increased renewable generation and research
2. Built environment - more climate responsive construction and operation
3. Green Infrastructure & biodiversity

**Businesses/organisations (although note that the response level was lower than for the public/young people surveys):**

1. Energy - demand reduction and renewable generation
2. Green Infrastructure & Biodiversity
3. Transport

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## Consultation Summary:

- **Good support for the proposed Council priorities and themes**
- **Suggests that Public/Business engagement is important throughout the full programme**
- **Behaviour Change –City/Council – a crucial and ongoing component and needs more development**

- **OPC Steering Group Chaired by the Leader established including senior Cabinet members.**

- **Resources : additional new posts – in year capacity support**

## CAPITAL PROJECTS £700k

- Air quality real time monitoring

- A pilot scheme to trial re-usable domestic recycling waste bags
- Roll out of enhanced food digestors facilities in schools
- Upgraded EV charging facilities to power the small fleet of electric waste vehicles at the Lamby Way Depot
