1. The following amendment to Cabinet's 2022/23 Budget Proposal is proposed, along with the updated recommendations set out at the end of this report.

- 2. The amendment reflects the receipt of the Final Local Government Settlement on 1 March 2022, which indicates that Cardiff Council's Aggregate External Finance (AEF) for 2022/23 will be £11,000 higher than indicated previously in the Provisional Local Government Settlement.
- 3. The Budget Report 2022/23 considered by Cabinet on 24th February 2022, set out a contingent arrangement at paragraph 24 in recognition of the timing of the Final Settlement announcement. This stated that should the funding allocation announced at Final Settlement differ from Provisional Settlement, the Council would either add to, or draw down from reserves in order to maintain a balanced budget position. Recommendation 12 to the 2022/23 Budget Report, approved by Cabinet on the 24th February 2022, authorised the Section 151 Officer to prepare an addendum to the 2022/23 Budget making requisite changes for consideration by Council on 3rd March 2022. This addendum, and the amendment set out in paragraph one above, are consistent with the delegated authority and indicative arrangement.
- 4. The updated Budget Summary for 2022/23 having taken account of the above adjustment is set out in the table below:

5. At £11,000, the change in funding involved is not material and does not impact on the substantive financial implications already set out in the 2022/23 Budget Report. Notwithstanding the small amount, this amendment is considered necessary, as the change in funding allocations announced at Final Settlement affect the statutory Council Tax resolutions, which are restated in this addendum, in order to reflect the confirmed funding position.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Cabinet, having taken account of the comments of the Section 151 Officer in respect of the robustness of the budget and the adequacy of the reserves as required under Section 25 of the Local Government Act 2003, and having considered the responses to the Budget Consultation recommend that Council:

- 1.0 Approve the Revenue, Capital and Housing Revenue Account budgets including all proposals and increasing the Council Tax by 1.9% as set out in this report and that the Council resolve the following terms.
- 2.0 Note that at its meeting on 16 December 2021 Cabinet calculated the following amounts for the year 2022/23 in accordance with the regulations made under Section 33(5) of the Local Government Finance Act 1992:
 - a) 149,107 being the amount calculated in accordance with Regulation 3 of the Local Authorities (Calculation of Council Tax Base) (Wales) Regulations 1995, as amended, as its Council Tax base for the year.
