














#### Project Gwyrdd



- 5 Councils (plus Welsh Government)
- Formed a procurement partnership in 2009 to:
  - Deliver a residual waste treatment contract diverting the waste that can not be readily recycled from landfill
  - Share procurement costs
  - Benefit from economies of scale
  - Increase project attractiveness
    - More competition
    - Better value-for-money outcome
  - Gain financial & expert support via partnering with Welsh Government






### **Key Facts**

- Waste reception commenced in 2014, since then, Trident Park ERF has processed over 2 million tonnes of waste – guaranteeing diversion from landfill through Energy from Waste.
- The facility's anchor contract is the Prosiect Gwyrdd contract contributing up to 170,000 tonnes per annum. Prosiect Gwyrdd is the Partnership of the counties and / or councils of Caerphilly, Cardiff, Monmouth, Newport and Vale of Glamorgan.
- Other fuel supply contracts into the facility includes the Tomorrows Valley contract circa 90,000 tpa – a collaboration of four Welsh County Councils: Blaenau Gwent, Merthyr Tydfil, Rhondda Cynon Taff and Torfaen. The facility also treats 20,000 tpa from Pembrokeshire County Council.
- The facility produces circa 35MWh of electricity through the treatment of waste, is R1 Compliant and is Combined Heat and Power enabled for a possible future district heating scheme. An electricity estimate capable of powering over 60,000 homes in Cardiff.
- Trident Park ERF is permitted to accept and treat 425,000 tonnes per annum, employs some 50 local staffing experts with support from other Viridor national teams. The facility also provides services to the immediate community through its Visitor & Centre.

     Guaranteed Minimum Payment "GMP")



















#### WG Funding



- Main Welsh Government Funding Streams:
  - Sustainable Waste Management Grant (for dry, food and green garden waste recycling services)
  - Procurement support:
    - ~£1.4m for Project Gwyrdd
  - 25 years revenue support (~25% of gate fee)




