I have caused enquiries to be made into this application and make the following representation that I wish to be considered when deciding on the licensable activity and conditions for this licence.

We therefore ask that the Licensing Committee hear the representation made by the Police when determining the grant of this application.

Should the applicants agree to comply with the representation made to meet the Licensing Objectives before a hearing then please accept that the Police will automatically withdraw their request for a hearing with the Licensing Committee.

# **POLICE REPRESENTATION**

1. A cctv system shall be installed to a standard agreed with South Wales Police. The system shall be maintained and operated at all times the premises are open to the public. The system shall cover all parts of the licensable areas to which the public have access (excluding toilets) and any outside areas, exits and entrances used by customers. Images shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days.

The images shall be produced to a Police employee immediately upon request when the premises are open and at all other times as soon as is reasonably practical. There will be sufficient staff training to facilitate the above.

2. The maximum number of customers consuming hot food inside the premises will be no more than nine at any one time.

If the applicant does not agree with the afore-mentioned representations the Police objections will be based on the following:-

1. The prevention of crime and disorder

(the use of cctv is a proven tool in both preventing crime and detecting it.

The premises are small and overcrowding can lead to confrontation between customers, particularly late at night when they may have consumed alcohol).

Additional evidence to support the notice of the objection will be presented at any subsequent Licensing Committee hearing. This evidence will be expanded on verbally, written, statistical or CCTV evidence.

The New York Pizza business has quite a history of applying for extensions to its business hours following numerous prosecutions in the past for working outside of its permitted hours. Its applications have been refused in the past and it is my opinion that conditions in Crwys Road and in the New York Pizza premises have not changed in any way that would suggest that it would now be appropriate to extend those licensing hours. I must therefore object most strongly to the issue of a licence which would permit the business to extend its active hours beyond 23.00 hours. My specific reasons are:

- 1) The premises are in the form of a takeaway shop which would be inappropriate for sales of hot food for consumption on premises
- 2) Extending the use of the premises in the way sought would inevitably lead to customers parking in the lane behind, thus adding to the public nuisance for residents (such as myself) from traffic blocking access.
- 3) I believe that the proposal might lead to an increase in the negative aspects of further provision in Crwys Road of late opening of premises known to be a magnet for customers who might already be under the influence of alcohol. South Wales Police have evidenced this before which is why the area is a part of the City Road/Crwys Road Saturation Policy.
- 4) There are other residential properties nearby and issues of noise and disturbance from car doors slamming, cars parking, and noise from the premises itself are all extremely likely to cause unacceptable levels of public nuisance.
- 5) The granting of a licence should not be considered unless the applicant has appropriate planning permission to accommodate the licence asked for. Cardiff's Planning Officers have advised that the premises do not at this time have the necessary planning permission to operate beyond 23.00 and that as nothing has changed since the last application, it is highly unlikely that such permission would be granted at this time.

I would request therefore that this licence application be denied on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance and/or crime and disorder.

To Whom it May Concern

I am writing to voice my objections to the above licensing application.

As a long term resident of Cathays, I have seen the area change over the years from a family area with young children to a predominantly student area. At the moment I would say that the area is beginning to change again with more young professionals living locally, which is a good social mix.

I think the student population can be a real asset to a city but there is no getting away from the increase in litter and increase in noise from loud music in the night. They often put their rubbish out at the wrong times and the seagulls rip open bags and rubbish is scattered. The waste disposal team do a great job in trying to keep the streets clean and tidy but each week they collect a lot of litter from gutters and streets. If this application is approved, then the litter, noise and disruption to residents will also very likely increase.

Extremely late opening times will also encourage people who have been to late bars and clubs using this facility and drunken, anti-social behaviour is also likely to increase. We often hear drunken students returning to their homes and often we find "take away" litter and empty alcohol bottles in the street the next day. If this application is approved then the area could suffer from noise for a lot longer in the night.

This is still a residential area and there are children living here who go to the local schools. This is not an appropriate area for late night/ early morning take away facilities.

As a local council I am sure that you are concerned about the well-being of these young children and their parents, as well as the rest of the permanent and temporary residents living in this area.

I hope that you will therefore refuse the application of New York Pizza in this area and thereby protect the area from an unwanted public nuisance.
