Application for Premises Licence - Grant

1. Application

1.1 An application for a Premises Licence – Grant has been received from Cardiff Council Economic Development (CIWW) in respect of Cardiff International White Water, Watkiss Way, Cardiff CF11 0SY.

- 1.2 The applicant has applied for the following:
 - (1) In respect of the following licensable activities:
 - (i) The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises.
 - (ii) The provision of regulated entertainment in the form of films (indoors and outdoors), indoor sporting events, live music (indoors and outdoors) and recorded music (indoors and outdoors).
 - (2) Description of Premises (as stated by applicant):
 - "Cardiff International White Water is a purpose built Outdoor Activity Centre in the heart of Cardiff Bay. Under normal operating conditions the centre operates a small café and catering facility to refresh attendees using the centre, nearby residents and also cater for meetings and small events held at the centre. In addition the centre plays host to major sporting and outdoor activity events which attract larger numbers of attendees from time to time"
 - (3) Unless otherwise indicated the premises may be open to the public during the following hours and for any hours consequential to the non-standard timings:

Monday to Sunday: 08:00 to 23:30 hours New Year's Eve: Until 01:00 hours on New Year's Day

- (4) To provide licensable activities during the following hours:
 - (i) The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on the premises:

Monday to Sunday: 11:00 to 23:00 hours New Year's Eve: 11:00 to 01:00 hours

- (ii) The provision of regulated entertainment in the form of films (indoors and outdoors) and indoor sporting events:Monday to Sunday: 08:00 to 23:00 hours
- (iii) The provision of regulated entertainment in the form of live music and recorded music (both indoors and outdoors):
 Monday to Sunday: 08:00 to 23:00 hours
 New Year's Eve: 08:00 to 01:00 hours

2. Promotion of Licensing Objectives.

2.1 The additional conditions proposed by the applicant to meet the licensing objectives are attached to the report and can be found in Appendix A.

3. Relevant Representations

- 3.1 Representations have been received in respect of the application from Cardiff Council's Neighbourhood Services and a number of 'other persons'. Copies of these representations can be found in *Appendix B*.
- 3.2 A representation was also received from South Wales Police but was subsequently withdrawn as the applicant and the Police agreed to have specific conditions imposed on the licence if the application is granted. A copy of the Police representation and the applicant's agreement can be found in *Appendix C*.

4. <u>Legal Considerations.</u>

4.1 In respect of the application the decision must be taken following consideration of the representations received with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:

Prevention of crime and disorder Public Safety Prevention of Public Nuisance Protection of Children from Harm

- 4.2 In each case the Sub-Committee may make the following determination
 - a) To grant the application.
 - b) To modify the conditions of the licence, by altering, omitting or adding to them, where relevant.
 - c) Reject the whole or part of the application.

4.3 All decisions taken by the Sub-Committee must (a) be within the legal powers of the Council and its Committees; (b) comply with any procedural requirement imposed by law; (c) be undertaken in accordance with the procedural requirements imposed by the Council e.g. standing orders and financial regulations; (d) be fully and properly informed; (e) be properly motivated; (f) be taken having regard to the Council's fiduciary duty to its taxpayers; and (g) be reasonable and proper in all the circumstances.

5. <u>Issues for Discussion.</u>

5.1 The application should be determined and the appropriateness of any conditions on the licence needs to be discussed.

List here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.

Cardiff International White Water is primarily a family-friendly activity centre and venue for related events. As such the centre is not primarily marketed as a bar or drinking venue although these activities taking place alongside its normal operational activities. Seating is provided throughout the venue to encourage the consumption of food with any alcohol and to promote the licensing objectives where possible at all times.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

In addition to the statutory measures required of this public venue, CIWW has installed CCTV recording images for the prevention of crime and disorder.

Staff on site carry radios.

At major events additional SIA Door staff are employed to control access and egress points. This prevents consumption of alcohol off the premises.

Staff serving alcohol are trained to assess the age of customers they are supplying alcohol to. If customers appear to be under 25 they will be required to provide proof they are over 18. A list of accepted forms of ID bearing the PASS hologram is displayed at all sale and supply points for reference.

A log of refusals of service will be maintained in the Centre.

During major events drinks will be served into plastic or polycarbonate drinking vessels instead of glass.

The Centre has a strict policy against the use or supply of drugs and any customer seen to be supplying or using drugs on the premises will be reported to the Police.

CIWW reserves the right to refuse entry.

c) Public safety

CIWW is committed to complying with all legislation relating to public safety, such as the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974, the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 and conducting suitable and sufficient risk assessments of their activities under both.

The Centre maintains adequate numbers of First Aid trained staff on site at all times it is open to the public.
All major events at the Centre are planned by our Events Partners in consultation with the City's Events Liaison Panel and relevant event Health and Safety guidance.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The Centre is aware of its location to nearby residences. It is an active member of the local tenants committee that meets regularly to update on neighbouring events. Members include The Cardiff International Pool, Cardiff Devils and the tenants from adjacent residential property. CIWW has a policy to formally notify adjacent properties of major events including those on Watkiss Way and across the River Ely in the Penarth Marina area who are most likely to be affected. Events are planned to minimise the nuisance to local residents and plans include measures such as reducing music levels outdoors at less sociable times.

Waste bins are located close to all premise exits to prevent litter being discarded off site.

Signs will be installed at each exit reminding customers to respect neighbours by leaving quietly and finishing drinks before they leave the premises.

e) The protection of children from harm

CIWW is a family friendly venue with offers for children and adults of all ages. Children are encouraged to participate in activities and the Centre is proud of its commitment to ensuring their safety at all times.

Staff serving alcohol are trained to assess the age of customers they are supplying alcohol to. If customers appear to be under 25 they will be required to provide proof they are over 18. A list of accepted forms of ID bearing the PASS hologram is displayed at all sale and supply points for reference.

Any age restricted films will be clearly advertised and a similar approach to age verification will take place during admission to any screenings at the Centre.

A log of refusals of service will be maintained in the Centre.

I wish to object to this application a premises licence under the "Prevention of Public Nuisance" objective.

The proposal involves the:

1. The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on the premises:

Cardiff International White Water: Application for alcohol and entertainment licence

With regard to the above application we would strongly object to this application insofar as it relates to the use of live and recorded music outdoors. The use of music indoors would be acceptable provided the sound is contained within the White Water site, but the use of music outdoors is bound to reduce the quality of enjoyment for nearby residences and might well amount to a nuisance.

As residents directly affected by the activities at the CIWW in Watkiss Way, we wish to raise the following objections to the above application.

- 1. The facility is in the middle of a residential area and noise from the activities at the centre inevitably affects residents. We live directly opposite the centre and there is already considerable noise pollution, exacerbated by the way sound carries across water. Currently, the facility is mainly used during the day and some evenings up to 21.00 hours and noise nuisance is usually of limited duration although its unpredictability is an issue in hot weather when it is reasonable for residents to have windows open. There have been many discussions with the centre asking for noise to be kept down, with some cooperation from the staff. However, if the premises are to be used for films, recorded and live music then increased noise pollution in the area is inevitable, particularly given the hours for which the license is requested.
- 2. Much use of the facility is made by children in school parties, birthday parties etc. Who will be responsible for policing the mixing of children with adults who are drinking? The combining of water sports and alcohol seems to be courting unacceptable danger.

There is also a climbing wall and zip wire etc in use at the centre, another risky activity when combined with the effects of alcohol.

Will there be any kind of check to be sure that no-one whose faculties are alcohol impaired is a danger to themselves or others, particularly children?

3. Since the centre is entirely open to the passing public and not just to paying clients, is it proposed that any passer by will be able to drink on the premises during licensing hours, as in a public house, even though there are licensed premises within easy reach of parties who wish to drink afterwards, away from the risks attendant on water sports?

The centre is a sports and training facility, not an entertainment venue.

I wish to object to the above application on the following grounds:- 1. The original Planning Application no. 11/01605 was granted on the basis that the White Water Centre would be a sports facility. Should this application be granted, it is so far reaching, that it will change to an Entertainments Centre. Thus a planning issue.

- 2. The above planning consent clearly states opening hours are to be as follows:- Mon/Tues/Thurs/Sat 9 to 5pm Weds/Frid 9 to 8pm Sun 9 to 4pm Should this application be granted, the noise nuisance already emanating from the site will be increased considerably, particularly during the Summer.
- 3. The Site does not lend itself to being easily monitored and, therefore, the sale of alcohol will create safety issues. Also adding to the noise nuisance.
- 4. Allowing films and entertainment outside again a noise issue.
- 5. The playing of music between the hours of 8 to 11pm outside will create an horrendous noise issue. It will also create a dangerous precedent for others to apply for this concession.
- 6. As a resident directly affected by the noise nuisance from the Centre, I would point out that I am entitled to quiet enjoyment of my property. If this application is allowed this will certainly not be the case. Therefore, a breach of planning laws.

* The prevention of crime and disorder;

I assert that the granting of a license will result in more crime and disorder in this vicinity with more people using the Marina area late at night leading to opportunistic crime and disorder.

* Public safety;

Mixing skilled sports of white water rafting, canoeing, and indoor surfing with alcohol can only lead to public danger. I would argue that the safety of participants and spectators cannot be guaranteed by the organisers if alcohol has been consumed.

* The prevention of public nuisance;

People returning home after a night of music and alcohol will no doubt cause a public nuisance. Everyone tolerates occasional late-night revelry such as bank holidays, but on a nightly basis this will become wearing for the many residents now living in this area.

Music will also cause a public nuisance especially if it is outside. The sounds travel across water and therefore Chandlers Way will be affected by this.

* The protection of children from harm.

Children could be at risk if they are under the supervision of adults who are inebriated (participants or spectators). It is possible that staff members could also be working under the influence of alcohol.

I therefore object to the granting of a new alcohol and music license (indoor and outdoor) to CIWW. I do not object to the showing of films indoors.

I write with some concern about this application, and believe several of my neighbours have the same view.


My flat is directly opposite the Cardiff International White Water facility, and it is a pleasure to see the activities from a distance (including hearing the noise from exuberant people using the equipment).

(The Police acknowledge that the applicant has offered a cctv condition, the above wording sets out exactly what is required of such a condition with the avoidance of doubt and is deemed more appropriate in the upholding of the prevention of crime and disorder).

If the applicant does not agree with the afore-mentioned representations the Police objections will be based on the following:-

Additional evidence to support the notice of the objection will be presented at any subsequent Licensing Committee hearing. This evidence will be expanded on verbally, written, statistical or CCTV evidence.
