



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

Premises Licence Application

Conditions

- 1. At least 70% of the public space will be occupied by tables and chairs.
- 2. All meals will be consumed at tables with non-disposable crockery.
- 3. The sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises will be ancillary to the taking of a substantial table meal with the exception of those customers in the hatched areas as indicated on the licensing layout drawing. In the hatched areas, substantial food shall be available throughout the premises at all times during the permitted hours.
- 4. There will be no self-seating, customers will be shown to their table by staff.
- 5. Food will be served by waiter/waitress service only.
- 6. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 8. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that all staff employed at the premises whose duties include the sale or supply of alcohol shall undertake and complete a relevant programme of training prior to them being authorised to sell or supply alcohol. Such training shall consist of providing staff with an understanding of:
 - (a) The need to ensure the responsible sale and supply of alcohol
 - (b) The need to refuse the sale and supply of alcohol to persons who are intoxicated or underage
 - (c) The need to seek credible age verification from persons seeking to be sold or supplied alcohol who may appear under the age of 18 years old
- 9. There will be appropriate signage at the premises requesting customers to leave quietly.
- 10. All external doors and windows at the premises shall remain closed at all times when regulated entertainment is provided save for ingress and egress.

- 11. Staff will routinely check the premises during the opening hours to ensure that the premises are clean and tidy
- 12. Empty glasses will be regularly collected and any spillage dealt with as soon as practicable.
- 13. The premises will operate a "Challenge 25" policy whereby any person attempting to buy alcohol who appears to be under 25 will be asked for photographic ID to prove their age. The recommended forms of ID that will be accepted are passports, driving licences with a photograph, photographic military ID or proof of age cards bearing the 'PASS' mark hologram.
- 14. No bar for the purpose of dispensing alcohol will be set up in the outside area.
- 15. On major event days in the Cardiff City Centre no glass vessels will be allowed in the outside area.
- 16. A cctv system shall be installed to a standard agreed with South Wales Police. The system shall be maintained and operated at all times the premises are open to the public. The system shall cover all parts of the licensable areas to which the public have access (excluding toilets) and all outside areas and exits and entrances used by customers. Images shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days.
- The images shall be produced to an authorised Police employee immediately upon request when the premises are open and at all other times as soon as is reasonably practical. There will be sufficient staff training to facilitate the above.
- 18. No recorded music shall be played in the outside area after 23:00 hours each day.
- 19. There will be no entertainment of a sexual nature such as striptease or lap dancing.

In regard to the above application to grant premises license, I wish to advise that the Licensing Authority of Cardiff Council will be objecting to the application.

A Cumulative impact Policy has been adopted for the City Centre area of Cardiff. The Licensing Authority has adopted the policy due to high levels of alcohol related crime and disorder, in the interests of public safety and the avoidance of nuisance.

The policy creates a presumption that new applications for Premises Licences will be refused unless the applicant can demonstrate the business will have no negative effect on any of the licensing objectives.

The premises detailed above falls within the boundary of the Cumulative Impact Zone and therefore an objection is submitted in respect to the following Licensing Objectives.

The prevention of crime and disorder.

The prevention of public nuisance.

There has been detail submitted in the application and within the operating schedule for how the operator will promote the licensing objectives within cumulative impact policy along with the prevention of crime and disorder and Public Nuisance. However the premise has requested that alcohol sold within the designated marked area on the plan shall not be ancillary to the partaking of a substantial table meal. The ground floor shows a small area located around the bar servery which in principal falls within the policy but could be considered as a compromise given the remaining additional measures have been adopted. However the first floor on the plan is completely marked as a hashed area effectively making the provision for alcohol sales not ancillary to a table meal in this entire area. This inclusion pushes the application within the red classification under the statement of licensing policy and Consequently the Licensing Sub-Committee will need consider this application in line with Cardiff Councils Cumulative Impact Policy. The licensing Authorities position

Premises Licence

- A CCTV system shall be installed to an agreed standard as approved by South Wales Police and it shall be maintained and operated at all times when the premises are open to the public. The system will cover all areas of the premises where the public have access (excluding toilets) including all entrances and exits. It will cover the external front of the premises with coverage extending to half way across the highway. Any outside area used for licensable activity will also be covered. The images will be kept for a minimum period of 31 days. The images will be produced to a police employee, in a readily playable format, immediately upon request when the premises are open to the public and at all other times as soon as reasonably practicable, subject to data protection legislation. There will be sufficient trained staff to facilitate the above. Signs will be prominently displayed, advising customers that CCTV is in operation at the premises.
- The Licence Holder shall submit, to the Police Licensing and the Local Authority, a separate Operating Schedule for each event where an external promoter, DJ or Artiste is involved at the premises. It shall be submitted in writing at least 28 days prior to the event. South Wales Police will notify the premise license holder in writing of any condition(s) that should apply to the operation of the event. If less than 28 days' notice is given in writing, any condition(s) applied by the police shall not be challenged by the applicant/Licence holder.
- A minimum of 5 Body worn cameras shall be utilised by door supervisors at the premises. The device(s) used shall be capable of recording video images and sound. Images from the body worn cameras shall be stored for a minimum of 31 days and shall be produced to a police employee, in a readily playable format, immediately upon request when the premises is open to the public and at all other times as soon as reasonable practicable, subject to data protection legislation. There will be sufficient trained staff to facilitate the above.
- Security Industries Agency (SIA) registered Door Supervisors will be employed when the premise is open to the public. There shall be a minimum of 8 SIA registered Door Supervisors on duty from opening. Once the number of attendees exceeds 600, additional Door Supervisors shall be provided at the ration of 1:75 or part thereof. Door supervisors shall each be equipped with a two-way radio to facilitate communication between themselves/management.
- Dedicated staff will be employed to assist the door staff with the primary responsibility of identifying potentially intoxicated individuals and to help them accordingly; there shall be a minimum of one such staff member on each floor of the premise whenever licensable activities take place.
- The premises will employ one dedicated booth host/hostess to supervise no more than three booths or one VIP area. It will be the responsibility of these members of staff to monitor the levels of intoxication of all patrons within the booths/VIP areas.
- 7 Hosts/hostesses will ensure that no bottles are allowed to leave the booths to which they have been appointed. Guests will not be allowed to have possession of bottles away from the booths.
- Searching and wanding (with a metal detecting wand or similar) will take place on the front door as risk assessed by the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) and door team (notices to advise of this shall be on display) A search policy shall be in place and will include procedures for the confiscation of prohibited articles, such as drugs and weapons. Searches shall be conducted at the discretion of Door Supervisors.
- 9 SIA registered door supervisors shall be provided outside of the premises for an additional period of 30 minutes after closing, to assist in the safe and orderly dispersal

- of patrons from the premises. Body cameras and high visibility vests, tabards or jackets shall be worn by door supervisors when employed in this function.
- Female security will be employed from midnight to ensure all female customers are arriving/leaving safely.
- A register of Door Supervisors shall be kept at the premises. The register shall show the full name, address, company and SIA registration number of each Door Supervisor with signed acknowledgment of start and end duty times from each Door Supervisor. The register shall be kept by the DPS for a minimum of 18 months and will be made available to a police employee on request.
- Queues of patrons waiting to enter the premises shall be supervised by SIA registered Door Supervisors and STORY staff in such a way that they do not cause any inconvenience to neighbouring premises or members of the public. High visibility vests, tabards or jackets shall be worn by Door Supervisors and STORY promotional staff when employed in this function.
- The premise shall operate the Drug Safe Scheme. The Drug Safe procedure will involve a dedicated log of illegal substances placed in the safe by staff. It will record details of where the substance was discovered (or from whom it was recovered) date and time as well as details of the person seizing the substance(s) their details shall also be included in the log entry. A sharps box shall be kept and used for the safe disposal of needles etc. at the premises.
- The DPS will ensure that an adequate system for measuring the number of patrons in the premise is used by Door Supervisors such as counting clickers. Numbers of patrons on the premise will be recorded each half hour. This record will be kept for a minimum for 18 months by the DPS and will be made available to the police employee upon request.
- The DPS or a Personal Licence Holder will be on the premise at all times licensable activity takes place.
- At all times when open to the public, the premise shall operate a radio system which is monitored by the local Authority and South Wales Police.
- An incident book, or record, will be kept and maintained at the premises. Each entry made shall carry the day, date and time that each report was made and pages shall carry sequential numbering. It will record the following;
 - (a) All crimes reported to the venue.
 - (b) All ejections of patrons, with details of the individual(s) if known.
 - (c) All complaints received (whether of a criminal or licencing nature).
 - (d) All incidents of disorder.
 - (e) The seizure of drugs and offensive weapons.
 - (f) All visits by a responsible authority or emergency service.

The DPS shall retain the incident book for a minimum of 18 months. The incident book will be made available to the police on request. Each reported incident will be dated and signed by the person making the report and that person's name will be clearly legible alongside the signature.

Purchase of alcoholic beverages will be possible only from static bars and table service. There will be NO mobile alcohol sales persons of any sort.

- The DPS will ensure that no advertisement relating to events at the premise will contain wording or references which cause offence, contain profane or inappropriate language (whether obvious or suggested) or image(s) of a nature which falls into any of the above categories.
- 20 Pre-booked alcoholic beverages:
 - One 75cl of spirits (being alcohol with an ABV content of 15.5% or more) or the equivalent is permitted to be pre-booked and pre-paid electronically per multiple of four customers.
 - One 75cl bottle of wine, sparkling wine or champagne is permitted to be pre-booked and pre-paid electronically per multiple of two customers.

Should the party size permit the ordering of more than one bottle, or the equivalent, of either spirits of wine, the bottle(s) may be delivered to the booth at the ration set out above.

- Table bottle sales: The sale of bottles of spirits at the table can only be made for VIP guests with booth bookings or designated seating; all pre-booked guests will be required to present a named guest list in which all those appearing to be under 21 years of age must present ID which must be validated at the door.
- 22 All bottles of spirits supplied to patrons will be fitted with a measured one shot pourer.
- A trained First Aider, dedicated specifically to that purpose, will be on the premise and available whenever the premise is open to the public. A dedicated area shall be provided for the purpose of providing care to patrons who are in need of assistance through injury or intoxication, or awaiting collection. In cases where patrons refuse all offer of assistance, all steps taken by staff at the premise shall be recorded, to evidence what efforts were made to ensure the safety of the individual concerned.
- Glass collectors shall be employed on all floors open to the public on Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays before a Bank holiday and Student Nights and shall be responsible for identifying patrons who appear to be intoxicated and to provide assistance as required. They will be easily recognisable.
- An age challenge scheme for use when alcohol sales are involved (such as Challenge 25) shall be in use at all times licensable activities are undertaken. Any person who appears to be under the specified age will be required to prove they are over 18 unless otherwise approved by South Wales Police. The only acceptable forms of identification in these circumstances are photographic identification documents, such as; Passport, PASS hologram or Driving licence. Where a customer's age is in doubt and no identification is available, no admission to the premise shall be allowed. Signs will be prominently displayed throughout the premise advising customers of this policy.

- No noise, capable of causing a nuisance to neighbouring residential properties, shall be permitted on the roof terrace. No musical equipment is permitted, or allowed to be positioned, on the rood terrace after 23:00 hrs or before 08;00 hrs daily. The roof terrace shall be screened by walls, no less than 7'6" high on all sides.

Roof Management Plan - STORY - agreed with South Wales Police on 16 Sep 2019

- 1. One door will be used for access to the roof terrace with the other door a fire exit.
- 2. Door staff numbers will follow the ratio as set out in the premises licence with a min of 2 at all times when the roof terrace is open to the public. Thereafter the first 100 people will follow a ratio of 1:75 (ie 2 door staff for 100 people, 3 door staff for 175 people. 4 door staff for 250 people etc)
- 3. Tally counters will be used to record numbers on the roof and logged with the front door every 30 mins.
- 4. Appropriate levels of bar staff will be employed on the bar to ensure that customers are served in a quick and orderly way abiding by the licensing conditions.
- 5. Sufficient staff will be available to ensure that the area is kept free of empty vessels, litter, etc.
- 6. There will be no glass vessels or bottles in the public areas on the roof terrace.
- 7. Ice buckets will be used on the roof for wine only as no spirit bottles or champagne will be served from the roof terrace bar. Ice buckets will be made of a lightweight plastic only.

- 9. Management of area to include attending to issues of noise and conduct of those queuing.
- 10. Roof terrace bar will close 30 minutes before the roof terrace closes.

In relation to the above application for grant of a premises license, I wish to advise that the Licensing Authority of Cardiff Council will be objecting to the application.

A Cumulative impact Policy has been adopted for the City Centre area of Cardiff. The Licensing Authority has adopted the policy due to high levels of alcohol related crime and disorder, in the interests of public safety and the avoidance of nuisance.

The policy creates a presumption that new applications for Premises Licences will be refused unless the applicant can demonstrate the business will have no negative effect on any of the licensing objectives.

The premises detailed above falls within the boundary of the Cumulative Impact Zone and therefore an objection is submitted in respect to the following Licensing Objectives.

The prevention of crime and disorder.

The prevention of public nuisance.

The operating schedule contains detailed information in relation to proposed conditions on how the premises intend to promote the licensing objectives. It is presumed these conditions are proposed to also cover the aspects raised under the Cumulative Impact Policy without directly stating so. Considering the application as a whole consequently the Licensing Sub-Committee will need consider this application in line with Cardiff Councils Statement of Licensing Policy and Cumulative Impact Policy.

If representation is sufficient to overturn the rebuttable presumption. It will need to be demonstrated to the Licensing Sub-Committee that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives if the Premises Licence were to be granted.

1. Application




- 4.2 In each case the Sub-Committee may make the following determination

Annex 1 Mandatory Conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."
- 5. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

- 6. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
 - (a)"duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b)"permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-
- $P = D + (DxV) \text{ http://www.legislation.gov.uk/ukdsi/2014/9780111109120/images/ukdsi_9780111109120_en_001$
 - (i)P is the permitted price,
 - (ii)D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
 - (i)the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii)the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii)the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- 7. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Mandatory condition: exhibition of films

- (1) Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
- (2) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.
- (3) Where-
- (a) the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
- (b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,

admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

- (4) In this section-
- □ "children" means persons aged under 18; and
- "film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c. 39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Mandatory Condition: door supervision

Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must:

- (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
- (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of that Act.
- (2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed-
- (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
- (b) in respect of premises in relation to-
- (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate,

under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or

- (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section-
- (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act (see section 3(2) of that Act) and
- (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. No more than 12 extensions of hours per year shall be allowed (excluding Temporary Events Notices). A period of 28 days notice will be given to the Police prior to such extension / occasion or event. The Police will have an absolute right to veto such an extension/occasion or event by giving the applicant 14 days notice in writing prior to the date.
- 2. No persons will consume alcohol on the premises outside permitted hours unless they are a resident of the hotel or a bona fide guest of such a resident entertained by a resident at his/her expense.
- 3. No person under 18 years of age will be permitted on the premises after 23:00 hours with the exception of residents or persons attending pre-booked private functions such as wedding receptions or other similar functions. All such persons under the age of 18 must be in the company of an adult after 23:00 hours.
- 4. Duly authorised Officers of the Council, Police Constables and duly authorised Officers of the South Wales Fire Service will at all reasonable times have free ingress to all parts of the licensed premises and the Licensee or the person in charge in the absence of the Licensee will comply with any reasonable fire preventive and safety measure that may be required of him by any duly authorised Fire Officer.
- 5. The Licensee will at all times conduct the premises in a decent, sober and orderly manner, and take whatever steps are necessary to ensure that there is no profanity, impropriety of language or gesture or any violent behaviour or conduct or any anti-social behaviour which is in any way offensive to public feelings or is likely to cause a breach of the peace.
- 6. A. The Designated Premises Supervisor or some responsible person, such as the holder of a Personal Licence, nominated in writing will be in charge of and present in the premises at all times when the public are on the premises and there shall also be during that time a sufficient staff or attendants in the building for the purpose of securing safety.
 - B. The Licensee and the staff of attendants will take due precautions for the prevention of accidents, and shall abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire
 - C. The DPS or the nominated person in charge of the premises, and at least one other member of the staff, will be properly instructed in the protection of the premises from fire, the use of the fire appliances provided and the method of summoning the Fire Authority.
- 7. The Licensee will consider registration with a Pub Watch or similar scheme.
- 8. The Licensee will ensure that a risk assessment including one specifically relating to fire risk at the Licensed Premises is carried out at regular intervals and put such measure in place to minimise the risk to public Safety.
- 9. The Licensee will take all due precautions for the safety of the public, performers and employees.
- 10. The Licensee will ensure that at regular intervals the premises are checked by a suitably qualified individual in respect of Electrical Safety and Emergency Lighting. In respect of electrical safety a suitable qualified person will be qualified Electrical Engineer who is a member of the Electricity Contractors Association and who will be required to issue a Certificate in accordance with the NICEIC, to the effect that the electrical installation has been examined and tested and are in a safe working condition. The Certificate will be submitted to the Licensing Authority.
- 11. Fire extinguishing appliances with such ancillary equipment as may be necessary for the protection of the licensed premises will be provided and maintained. A certificate from a suitably qualified person will be provided to the authority at suitable intervals.
- 12. A. Persons awaiting admission to the premises will not be allowed to congregate in any part of the premises except positions approved by the duly authorised Fire Officer.
 - B. The total number of persons that may be accommodated in the licensed premises will not at any one time exceed the maximum safe capacity.
 - C. Overcrowding in such a manner as to endanger the safety of public will not be permitted in any part of the premises.
- 13. The Licensee will require the use of at least 2 "clickers" or counting machines to monitor the number of patrons entering and leaving the premises which must be made available for inspection by authorised officers of the Council, the Police and the Fire Authority.
- 14. The premises will be provided with an adequate number of exits so placed and maintained as to afford the public ready and ample means of safe egress. All doors leading from exits into passages or the outside of the premises will be kept open and fastened back by means of a padlock or other device, and be kept clear of obstruction. Temporary barriers will not be fitted, and any permanent barrier in

exit-ways which may be provided for checking or controlling admission, will be so arranged that the portion immediately in the line of exit will open automatically upon pressure being applied in the direction of exit.

- 15. The number, size and position of all doors or openings provided for the purpose of the egress of the public from the premises shall be to the satisfaction of the Fire Authority.
- All exit doors or openings will be clearly indicated by appropriate fire safety signs which are compliant with either the Health and Safety (Safety Signs and Signals) Regulations 1996 or BS5499:Part 1:1990 and hung to open in the direction of exit or be double swing, and when so hung not to open immediately over a step or steps. Door and openings, other than exits, which lead to portions of the premises inaccessible to the public will have notices placed over them indicating the use of such portions to be marked "PRIVATE". Such notices and signs indicating the way out of the premises will be provided as necessary and will comply with the relevant current British Standard Conditions.
- 17. Only such parts of the premises as indicated on the plan will be used as retiring rooms, or cloakrooms, and corridors, passages, gangways or exit ways used by the public will not be used for this purpose.
- 18. No fastenings, other than automatic bolts, will be used on exit doors used by the public, except that cabin hooks or stops to keep the exit doors in an open position may be fitted only with the approval of the Fire Officer Authority. Automatic bolts will be of such a pattern that horizontal pressure on the cross-bars will open the doors. The cross-bars will, where practicable, be placed at a height of 3 feet from the bottom of the door. Doors fitted with automatic bolts shall have the words "PUSH BAR TO OPEN" painted upon them in block letters at least 4 inches high.
- 19. If chains, padlocks or other locking devices for securing exit doors are used when the public are not on the premises, the Designated Premises Supervisor will be required to remove such chains, padlocks, or other devices before the admission of the public, and such chains, padlocks or other devices shall not be replaced during the whole time the public are present in the licensed premises.

 Where collapsible gates or roll up shutters are used they will be locked in the open position whilst the public are present. Revolving doors will not be used as exit doors.
- 20. The lavatories, WC's and urinals in the licensed premises will at all times be kept in good order and repair, and be properly and effectually cleansed, ventilated, disinfected and supplied with water, and the doors leading thereto shall be suitably marked. The Licensee will provide and maintain in a suitable position such number of sanitary conveniences for the use of persons frequenting the premises as is necessary.
- 21. Water shall be provided free and unrestricted access shall be given to cold drinking water at all times.
- 22. A Residual Current Circuit Breaker or Residual Current Device having a 30 mA tripping circuit as an integral part of the wiring installation will be installed to power supplied in areas provided for live performances and all electric lamp holders within reach of the public shall be kept fitted with lamps or otherwise protected.
- 23. A. In all parts of the licensed premises and in all passages, paths, courts, ramps and staircases to which the public have access, and which lead to adequately illuminated thoroughfares or the public highway, a means of illumination will be provided (referred to as the general lighting) capable of illuminating those parts clearly. The general lighting shall not be provided by means other than electricity without the consent of the Fire Authority.
 - B. Licensed premises situated other than on the ground floor of any premises and where so situated on the ground floor at the discretion of the South Wales Fire Officer shall as from the date of these conditions be provided with a secondary system of lighting (hereinafter referred to as the safety lighting system). The safety lighting system shall be installed in all portions of the licensed premises including staircases and corridors to which the public have access and will provide a sufficient degree of lighting to enable the public to see their way out of the licensed premises. It will illuminate all exit notices and shall be taken from a separate source and maintained independent of the general lighting of the licensed premises. Efficient arrangements shall also be made by means of a switch or other device for the testing of the safety lighting system when provided at the same time that the general lighting system is in operation.
- 24. Maintained internally illuminated exit signs will be provided when lighting is to be dimmed or extinguished.
- Any necessary gas piping will be of iron or brass and all fixed and ordinary gas burners shall be furnished with efficient mantles and globes. Gas taps within reach of the public shall be of the key pattern. Ovens, geysers, gas rings and other gas appliances will not be installed except in positions or rooms approved by the Council. If installed they will be mounted upon approved incombustible materials and connected to the supply by rigid piping. Rubber or soft metal tubing will not be used. The room or other place in which any such appliance is installed shall be properly ventilated.
- Apparatus controlling or associated with a supply of gas for lighting or heating purposes such as main valves and stop cocks, will be situated as near as it is practicable to an entrance easily accessible from a public highway and shall be secured against unauthorised interference. Portable LPG appliances will not be used or stored within the licensed premises.
- 27. All floors, carpets and coverings will be secured and maintained so that they will not ruck or be in any way a source of danger.
- 28. A. Any hangings or curtains over exit doors or across gangways will be made to part in the centre, to hang so to be readily drawn aside and not to trail on the floor, and be arranged so as not to conceal notices.
 - B. All decoration, permanent or temporary will be of inherently incombustible materials or treated and so maintained so that they will not readily catch fire.

- No rubbish or waste paper will be stored or allowed to accumulate in any part of the licensed premises or adjacent thereto.
- 30. All parts of the premises and fittings therein, including the seating, door fastenings and notices, will be properly maintained at all times in good order and condition.
- 31. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways will be made conspicuous with appropriate markings as necessary and all gangways, exitways and the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained with a non-slip surface.
- A. The public parts of the premises will be kept properly and sufficiently ventilated and heated and the temperatures and air quality monitored and immediately improved where necessary.
 B. Every heating appliance used in the premises, which are within reach of any member of the public, will be fitted with guards
 - B. Every heating appliance used in the premises, which are within reach of any member of the public, will be fitted with guards which comply to the standards of the construction and fitting, required by the Heating Appliance (Fire Guard) Regulations 1953, in the case of heating appliances of a type which are so designed that they are suitable for use in residential premises; and every heating appliance used in the premises will be situated sufficiently far from woodwork, hangings or other materials or substances liable to catch fire so that there is to be no likelihood of fire by reason of their proximity to the heating appliance.
 - C. Every heating appliance situated in part of the premises to which the public are admitted shall be fixed in position.
 - D. Rooms in which boilers or similar apparatus are installed will be separated from the remainder of the premises by fire resisting construction.
- 33. No dangerous substance, chemical, explosive or highly inflammable substance will be kept at the premises which may cause a public safety risk.
- 34. A. The licensee shall ensure that all persons responsible for security, protection, screening the suitability of people entering premises or dealing with conflict in pubs, clubs and other licensed premises open to the public shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
 - B. The Designated Premises Supervisor will maintain a duty register of all persons engaged as Door and Security Staff. The register will include the following details:-
 - (a) The registration number and name and address of that person.
 - (b) The date and time at which he/she commenced duty with a signed acknowledgment by that person.
 - (c) The date and time at which he/she finished that period of duty with a signed acknowledgment by that person.
 - (d) If that person is not an employee of the licensee, the name of the person or company or agency by whom that person is employed or through whom the services of that persons are engaged.
 - (e) The register shall be so kept that it can be readily inspected by an authorised officer of the Council or a Police Officer.
 - (f) The register shall be bound and consecutively numbered and the licensee shall ensure it is kept secure in order to prevent unauthorised access or alterations to same.
 - (g) The licensee shall keep the register secure and records must be kept for a period of 3 years.
- 35. No exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism (as defined in section 6 of the Hypnotism Act 1952) shall be given by any person at the Licensed Premises by any person who has not obtained the appropriate consent from the Council. The licensee will ensure that any conditions in respect of such events supplied by the Council are complied with.
- 36. The Licensee will ensure that sufficient measure are taken to prevent any noise on the premises causing nuisance or disturbance to persons in the vicinity.
- 37. The Licensee will ensure that the disposal of refuse, such as the placing of bottles into receptacles outside the premises and waste disposal collections, take place at times that will minimise disturbance to nearby properties.
- 38. Notices Prominent, clear and legible signage may need to be placed at all exits requesting that patrons respect the needs of local residents, leaving the premises and surrounding area quietly.
- 39. A. The licensee will take all reasonable steps to ensure that their premises are not in any way promoted by the use of illegal fly-posting or unauthorised advertisements attached to street furniture.
 - B. The licensee will take all reasonable steps to ensure that contracts with promoters for the use of their premises or for events to be held at their premises prohibit the use of illegal fly-posting and/or advertisements attached to street furniture, and shall take all steps necessary to enforce such contract terms.
 - C. The licensee will take all reasonable precautions and exercise all due diligence to ensure that no person promoting or providing entertainment on the premises, nor any person acting on behalf of any such person, shall display in an unlawful manner advertisements promoting the entertainment or the premises, in particular;
 - a. no display of advertisements should take place on street furniture;
 - b. no display of advertisements should take place on premises or structures placed on, over, in or adjacent to the highway, unless the licensee has first obtained the written consent of the owner of the premises or structure. Such consent shall be shown to the licensing authority on request.
 - D. The licensee will take all reasonable steps to forthwith remove any unlawful advertisements of events at their premises where the Council have given notice in writing to the Licensee requiring their removal. Any unreasonable failure to remove any

unlawfully displayed advertisement in accordance with such a request shall be a breach of these conditions.

- 40. No performance of striptease, lap dancing or other similar entertainment will be permitted on the premises without the permission of the Licensing Authority and in accordance with any conditions required by the authority.
- The Licensee will consider complying with the Portman Group Code of Practice on the Naming, Packaging and Promotion of Alcoholic 41 Drinks to ensure that drinks are packaged and promoted in a socially responsible manner and only to those who are 18 years old or older. Proof of Age documentation will be required where relevant.
- No poster, advertisement, photograph or other material will be displayed, sold or supplied on the premises, which is likely to 42. offend morality, encourage or incite crime or to lead to disorder or to be offensive to public feelings.
 - В. Where the Council have given Notice objecting to an advertisement, that advertisement shall not be displayed on or in the premises except with the consent in writing of the Council.

Non standard timings

No more than 12 extensions of hours per year shall be allowed (excluding Temporary Events Notices). A period of 28 days notice will be given to the Police prior to such extension / occasion or event. The Police will have an absolute right to veto such an extension/occasion or event by giving the applicant 14 days notice in writing prior to the date.

I have caused enquiries to be made into this application. The premises is an existing business and is located at Castle Street in Cardiff.

The premises sits within the area as defined by Cardiff City Council as being that covered by their Culmalative Impact Policy. As such, South Wales Police object to the granting of the variation to the existing premises licence as applied under the following licensing objectives, namely;

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

Public Safety.

It is therefore incumbent on the applicant to demonstrate to the Council Licensing Sub-committee that the applicant will put in place sufficent measures to ensure that there will be no additional impact made by the premises on the area.

However, should the Licensing sub-committee be so disposed to grant the application as requested, then be advised that South Wales Police make the following representations on order to support and promote the following licensing objectives;

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POLICE REPRESENTATIONS.

'When Licensable activity is conducted at 29-31Castle Street, the following conditions will apply'

- 1. A CCTV system shall be installed to a standard as approved by South Wales Police and maintained and operated at all times the premises are open to the public. The system will cover all internal areas of the premises where the public have access {excluding toilets} including all entrances and exits and any external areas associated with the premises. The images shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days and shall be produced to a Police employee in a readily playable format immediately upon request when the premises are open and at all other times as soon as reasonably practicable. There will be sufficient trained staff to facilitate the above.
- 2. A minimum of two SIA registered door supervisors will be employed at all times the premises is open on a ratio of 2 door supervisors to the first 100 patrons. Additional door supervisors will be employed on a ratio of 1:100, or part thereof after this. SIA door supervisors will be employed from 30 minutes before the planned event to 15 minutes after it ends, to assist in safe dispersal of attendees. These SIA door supervisors shall each be equipped with two way radio, to facilitate communication between themselves and management.
- 3. When SIA registered door supervisors are employed at the premises they will utilise at least two body worn video device. Any such devices will be capable of recording both audio recordings and visual images. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and will be produced to a Police employee in a readily available format immediately upon request when the premises are open and at all other times as soon as reasonably practicable. There will be sufficient trained staff to facilitate the above.
- 4. A register of door supervisors shall be kept at the premises. The register shall show the full name, address, company, SIA registration number and licence expiry date of each Door Supervisor with signed acknowledgement of start and end duty times from each Door Supervisor. The register shall be kept by the DPS for a minimum of 12 months and will be made available to a police employee upon request.
- 5. There will be no mobile alcohol sales persons of any sort. All alcohol will be sold from static bars.
- 6. An incident book shall be kept at the premises and maintained on site for a period of twelve months. It shall be made available on request to an authorised officer of the local authority or a member of police staff, which will record the following:

All crimes reported to the venue

Any complaints received (of a Criminal or Licensing nature)

Any incidents of disorder

Any refusal of the sale of alcohol.

Any visit by a representative of a relevant authority or a member of the emergency services.

Any failures of the CCTV system.

7. The full name of the designated manager on duty supervising 29-31 Castle Street will be recorded in either a written or electronic rota, prior to the opening of the premises for the sale and

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supply of alcohol. This rota is to be held on the premises and made available to a Police employee upon request.

- 8. Individuals shall not be allowed to purchase more than 4 drinks at any single visit to the bar located at 29-31 Castle Street. A drink consists of one pint, one half, a glass of wine or a single measure of spirit.
- 9. At least 70% of the public space within 29-31 Castle Street {as indicated in the attached plan reference 7611L[OO]50} of the premises will be occupied by tables and chairs.
- 10. On those days designated by South Wales Police as major event days in the City Centre and Bay areas of Cardiff, all drinks will be dispensed in 'non glass' vessels.
- 11. There will be no off sales from 29-31 Castle Street.
- 12. When door supervisors are employed at the premises, they will utilise an electronic counting device (or provide two clicker-type counting machines) for monitoring the number of patrons entering and leaving the premises.
- 13. The premises will operate a South Wales Police approved radio system.
- 14. Use of the premises will cease at 1am daily.
- 15. The Premises Licence holder shall submit to the Police Licensing department, a separate operating schedule for each event where an external promoter, external artiste or external DJ is involved at the premises. It shall be submitted in writing at least 28 days prior to the event. South Wales Police will notify the premises licence holder in writing of any conditions that should apply to the operation of the event within 10 days of receiving written notification of the event. If less than 28 days written notice is given by the premises licence holder, any condition(s) applied by the Police shall not be challenged by the applicant / premises licence holder.
