1. Application

- 1.1 An application for the Grant of a Premises Licence has been received from Heron Foods Limited in respect of Heron Foods, The Caerau, Bishopston Road, Caerau, Cardiff, CF5 5DZ

 - "Heron Foods is a convenience store selling frozen and convenience store goods"
 - (3) Unless otherwise indicated the premises may be open to the public during the following hours and for any hours consequential to the non standard timings:

- (4) To provide licensable activities during the following hours:
 - a) The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption off the premises.


5. Issues for Discussion.

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

South Wales Police would propose the following 'model' conditions based on those offered above.

*Amend the offered CCTV conditions 1 to 4 to the following single condition.

1.A CCTV system shall be installed to a standard as approved by South Wales Police and maintained and operated at all times the premises are open to the public. The system will cover all internal areas of the premises where the public have access {excluding any toilets} including all entrances and exits and any external areas associated with the premises. The images shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days and shall be produced to a Police employee in a readily playable format immediately upon request when the premises are open and at all other times as soon as reasonably practicable. There will be sufficient trained staff to facilitate the above.

**Amend the offered Incident Book conditions, 5&6 to the following single condition;

2.An incident book will be kept and maintained at the premises at all times. It shall be made available on request to a Police employee. This book will record the following:

All crimes reported at the venue

All refusals of sales of alcohol

Any ejections of patrons

Any disorder on the premises

Any visit by representatives of a relevant authority or emergency service

Any failure of the CCTV system.

- 3.No alcohol shall be displayed for sale within a 3 metre radius of the public entrance/exit to the premises.
- 4.No super-strength beer, lagers, ciders or spirit mixtures of 5.5% { alcohol by volume} or above shall be sold at the premises.
- 5. There will be no sale of single cans of beer, lager or cider from the premises.
