1. **Application**

1.1 An application for the Grant of a Premises Licence has been received from Samson Fessehaye-Araya in respect of Red Sea Café & Restaurant, 49-50 Clifton Street, Cardiff, CF24 1LS.

1.2 The applicant has applied for the following:

(1) In respect of the following licensable activities:

(i) The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on the premises.

(2) Description of Premises (as stated by applicant):

"10 tables, 4 seats each. Alcohol will be served from 11am to 11pm".

(3) Unless otherwise indicated the premises may be open to the public during the following hours and for any hours consequential to the non-standard timings:

Monday to Sunday: 11:00 to 23:00

(4) To provide licensable activities during the following hours:

(i) The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on the premises:

Monday to Sunday: 11:00 to 23:00

1.3 A site map showing the premises and a plan of that premises can be found in **Appendix A**.

2. **Promotion of Licensing Objectives**

2.1 The additional conditions proposed by the applicant to meet the licensing objectives are attached to the report and can be found in **Appendix B**.

3. **Relevant Representations**

4. Legal Considerations

4.1 In respect of the application the decision must be taken following consideration of the representations received with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:

Prevention of crime and disorder
Public Safety
Prevention of Public Nuisance
Protection of Children from Harm

4.2 In each case the Sub-Committee may make the following determination

- a) To grant the application.
- b) To modify the conditions of the licence, by altering, omitting or adding to them, where relevant.
- c) Reject the whole or part of the application.

4.3 All decisions taken by the Sub-Committee must (a) be within the legal powers of the Council and its Committees; (b) comply with any procedural requirement imposed by law; (c) be undertaken in accordance with the procedural requirements imposed by the Council e.g. standing orders and financial regulations; (d) be fully and properly informed; (e) be properly motivated; (f) be taken having regard to the Council's fiduciary duty to its taxpayers; and (g) be reasonable and proper in all the circumstances.

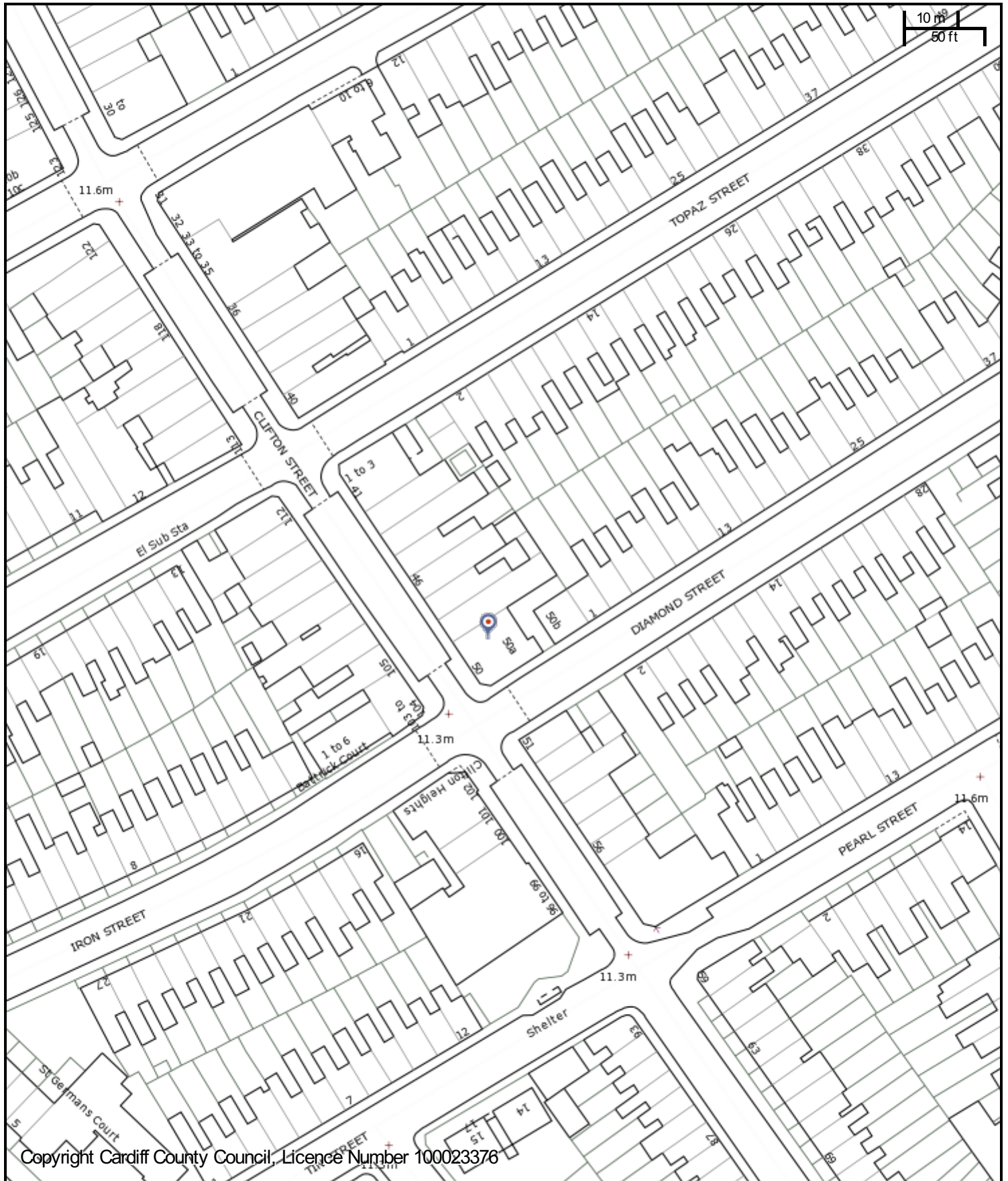
5.1 The application should be determined and the appropriateness of any conditions on the licence needs to be discussed.

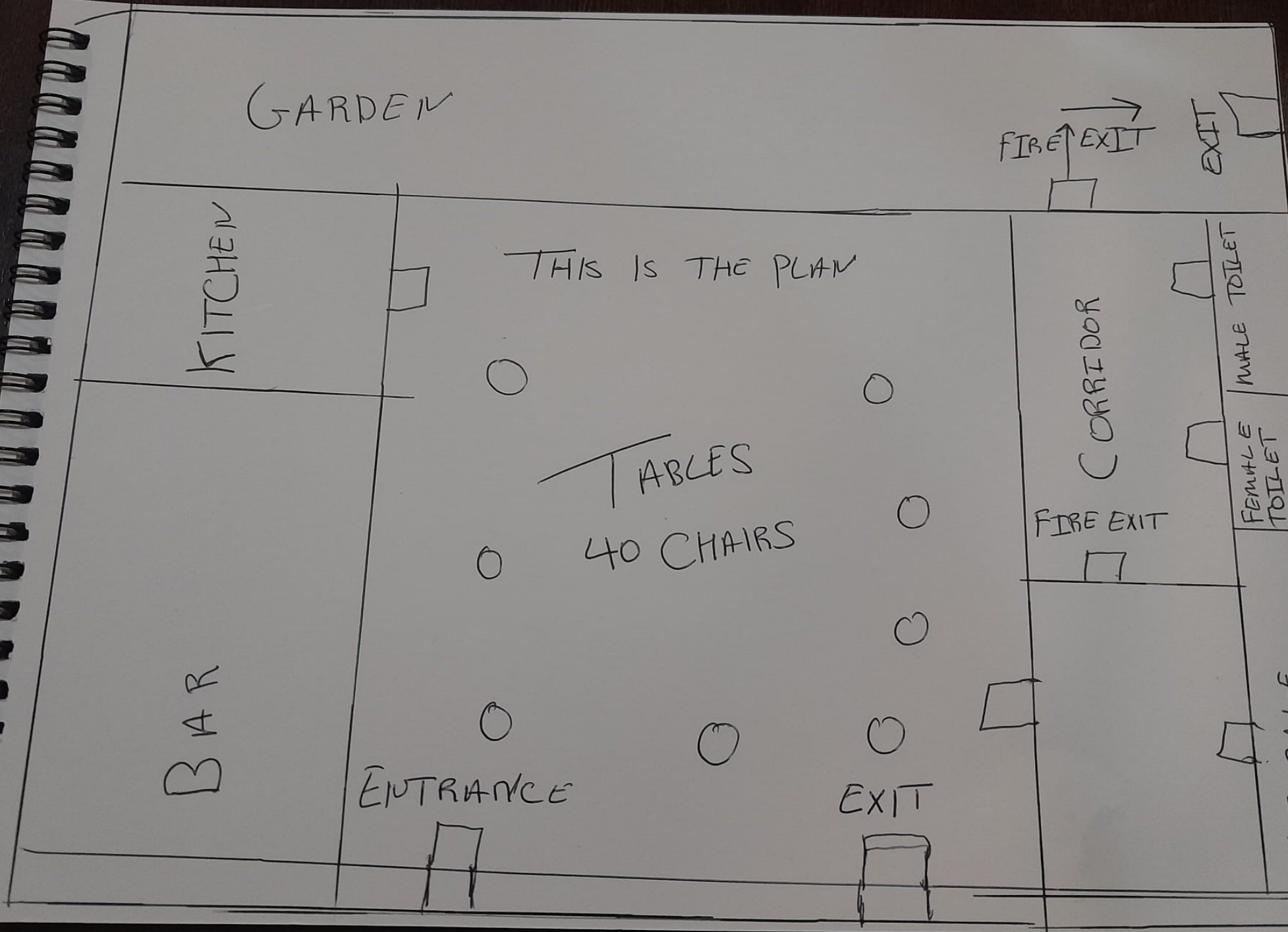

APPLICATION FOR THE VARIATION OF A PREMISES LICENCE UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 2003.

"RED SEA CAFÉ & RESTAURANT, 49-50 CLIFTON STREET, ADAMSDOWN, CARDIFF, CF24 1LS"

I have caused enquiries into this application and make the following representation that I wish to be considered when deciding on the licensable activity and conditions for this licence.

You, as the applicant, have applied for a premises licence for a Café & Restaurant and for the sale of alcohol on premise only. The red sea café & restaurant is situated at 49 – 50 Clifton Street.

The application is to allow the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises as follows:

Monday to Sunday 11:00 – 23:30 hours



The premises is contained over 1 floor, the premises consists of a small bar and kitchen area, 10 tables with 4 chairs at each table and a pool table. There is also a second pool table in a small separate room which is a very small area. There is a very small external garden area which will be utilised as a smoking area.

The premises is situated on Clifton Street, Cardiff within busy shopping/commercial street. There are a number of other similar business in the immediate vicinity as well as other retail outlets selling a variety of items. There are also several licenced premises within the same area.

Opening times of the premise:

Monday to Sunday 11:00 – 23:00 hours

Measures offered by the applicant in support of the application:

CONCLUSION

South Wales Police wish to object to the grant of this application under the Licensing Objectives;

Prevention of Crime and Disorder



Prevention of public nuisance

Protection of children from harm

There is a disproportionate amount of crime, disorder and nuisance within the immediate and surrounding areas, including that of local street drinkers and local youths.

However, should the committee be minded agreeing to this application, South Wales Police ask that the following additional conditions are attached to the premise licence.

If you as the applicant are in agreement with these conditions, then South Wales Police would then automatically withdraw their objection.

Hours agreed for the sale of alcohol:

Monday to Sunday 11:00 – 22:30 hours

- 1) The premises Licence shall only remain in force for as long as the daily use of the premises is that of a restaurant.

- 2) A CCTV system will be installed to a standard agreed by South Wales Police. It will be maintained and operated at all times the premises are open to the public. The system shall cover all licensable areas to which the public have access (excluding toilets) images will be kept for a minimum of 31 days. The images will be produced to a police employee in a readily playable format immediately on request when the premises are open and at all other times as soon as reasonably practical. There will be sufficient staff training to facilitate this.

- 3) An incident record will be kept at the premises. Any incident of crime and disorder witnessed by staff, or any incident reported by customers is to be noted in the log. Records will be kept for a minimum of 12 months. The following information shall be recorded in relation to each incident.
 - i) Date and time of the incident
 - ii) Name of person making the report



- iii) Names of parties involved (if known) or description of the parties (in as much detail as possible)
- iv) Nature of the incident
- v) Any action taken thereafter
- vi) Refusals of sale

Staff will be trained in relation to their responsibility to complete an incident report. Access to incident reports shall be made available to South Wales Police on request.

- 4) At least 70% of the public space will be occupied by tables and chairs when licensable activities are taking place.
- 5) Substantial food shall be available throughout the premises at all times during opening hours.
- 6) Alcohol will not be permitted in the external garden area.
- 7) Notices which state “No alcohol to be taken off the premises” will be placed throughout the café.
- 8) Anyone selling/supplying alcohol will receive relevant training in relation to alcohol sales and the promotion of the licensing objectives. This training will be refreshed annually with a record held on the premises. The training record shall be retained for a period of 18 months and will be made available for inspection upon request by a South Wales Police officer or other authorised person.
- 9) The licence holder will take appropriate measures to ensure that patrons leave the premises in a quiet and orderly fashion.
- 10) No music will be played in the rear external area of the premises.



- 11) A challenge 25 scheme shall operate at the premises (to minimise the risk of alcohol being sold to underage customers). This policy shall provide that before any sale of alcohol any person who appears to be under the age of 25 will be required to produce photo ID in the form of a passport, driving licence, UK Military ID card, PASS (or similar) card to prove that he/she is over the age of 18. Posters advertising the Challenge 25 and proof of age policies will be displayed in prominent places in the premises. All staff will be trained and regularly refreshed on the Challenge 25 policy. Training will be recorded and made available to enforcement authorities.

- 12) No persons under the age of 18 are allowed into or remain on the premises after 21:00 hours.

- 13) All children must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

- 14) There will be no entertainment of a sexual nature such as striptease or lap dancing.

I object to this application due to a number of reasons:

- 1) The venue does not have any identifiable name on the building
- 2) The customers of this building currently hang around outside their front door, there is no outside area that is safe for their customers and doesn't block the highway, with potentially drunk patrons they will be more likely to do this.
- 3) I have had negative personal interaction with their customers - offers of drugs to myself, and harassment to my partner.
- 4) I have witnessed multiple underage girls interacting with their customers while hanging outside, I would be concerned they would be provided alcohol.

I feel the provision of a premises licence to this venue would not uphold the 4 licensing objectives.
