Application for Premises Licence - Variation

Application No: 087679

Name of Premises: Cosy Club, Unit 24, Mermaid Quay, Cardiff Bay, Cardiff, CF10 5BZ

Ward: Butetown

1. Application

- 1.1 An application to vary a Premises Licence has been received from Loungers UK Limited in respect of Cosy Club, Unit 24, Mermaid Quay, Cardiff Bay, Cardiff, CF10 5BZ.
- 1.2 The applicant has applied for the following:
 - (1) Description of the nature of the variation (as stated by applicant):

"The premises is a food led café bar. The variation is to do the following:

1. To allow for off sales of alcohol at all times on sales of alcohol are currently permitted by the licence i.e. 1000-2330 Sunday to Wednesday and 1000-0100 Thursday to Saturday.

2. To remove the non-standard timings for New Year's Eve for the sale of alcohol, the provision of late night refreshment and opening hours.

3. To include in Annex 2 the following condition "The premises may remain open for the sale of alcohol and the provision of late night refreshment from the terminal hour for those activities on New Year's Eve through to the commencement time for those activities on New Year's Day."

4. To allow for the provision of regulated entertainment between 2300 New Year's Eve and 0800 New Year's Day.

5. To remove restrictions to opening hours on New Year's Eve and New Year's Day".

2. <u>Current Licence</u>

- 2.1 The current Premises Licence permits the following:
 - (1) The premises may currently be open to the public during the following hours and for any hours consequential to the non-standard timings:

Sunday to Wednesday: 08:00 to 00:00 hours Thursday to Saturday: 08:00 to 01:30 hours New Years Eve: 08:00 to 02:30

(2) The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on the premises:

Sunday to Wednesday: 10:00 to 23:30 hours

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Thursday to Saturday: 10:00 to 01:00 hours New Years Eve: 10:00 to 02:00 hours

(2) The provision of late night refreshment (indoors):

Sunday to Wednesday: 23:00 to 00:00 hours Thursday to Saturday: 23:00 to 01:30 hours New Years Eve: 23:00 to 02:30

2.2 A site map showing the premises and a copy of the plan attached to the current Premises Licence can be found in *Appendix A*.

3. <u>Promotion of Licensing Objectives</u>

3.1 The conditions proposed by the applicant to meet the licensing objectives are attached to the report and can be found in *Appendix B* along with a copy of the current licence conditions.

4. <u>Relevant Representations</u>

4.1 A representation has been received from South Wales Police. A copy of the representation can be found attached as *Appendix C*.

5. <u>Legal Considerations</u>

5.1 In respect of the application the decision must be taken following consideration of the representations received with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:

Prevention of crime and disorder Public Safety Prevention of Public Nuisance Protection of Children from Harm

- 5.2 In each case the Sub-Committee may make the following determination
 - a) To grant the application.
 - b) To modify the conditions of the licence, by altering, omitting or adding to them, where relevant.
 - c) Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 5.3 All decisions taken by the Sub-Committee must (a) be within the legal powers of the Council and its Committees; (b) comply with any procedural requirement imposed by law; (c) be undertaken in accordance with the procedural requirements imposed by the Council e.g. standing orders and financial regulations; (d) be fully and properly informed; (e) be properly motivated; (f) be taken having regard to the Council's fiduciary duty to its taxpayers; and (g) be reasonable and proper in all the circumstances.


6. <u>Issues for Discussion</u>

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

(1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3) (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried

on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3. The responsible person must ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

4. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the

permitted price.

- 5. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
 - (a)"duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b)"permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

where-

(i)P is the permitted price,

(ii)D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c)"relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii)the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii)the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d)"relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e)"valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994

- 6. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. All customers using the outside area will be seated at tables with waiter/waitress available at all times. The use of outside area will terminate at 23:00 hours.
- 2. A CCTV system shall be installed to a standard agreed with South Wales Police. The system shall be maintained and operated at all times the premises are open to the public. The system shall cover all parts of the licensable areas to which the public have access (excluding toilets) and all exits and entrances used by customers. Images shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days. The images shall be produced to a Police employee immediately upon request when the premises are open and at all other times as soon as is reasonably practical. There will be sufficient staff training to facilitate the above.
- 3. Management and staff shall be in attendance in the trading area at all times that alcohol is sold or supplied.
- 4. The premises licence holder shall require the Designated Premises Supervisor, or in his/her absence, other responsible person, to keep an 'incident/refusals' log book in a bound book in which full details of all incidents are recorded. This shall include details of any refused sales and shall give details of the persons involved, incident description, time and date, actions taken and final outcome of the situation. This shall be completed as soon as possible and in any case no later than the close of business on the day of the incident. The time and date when the report was completed, and by whom, is to form part of the entry. The log book is to be kept on the premises at all times and kept for a minimum of 12 months from the date of each entry. The log book shall be produced to an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable when required.
- 5. Background music shall not be played at a level that will cause unreasonable disturbance to the occupants of any properties in the vicinity.
- 6. The licence holder shall co-operate with Police or Officers of the Local Authority in the implementation of any initiatives to combat crime, disorder, antisocial behaviour or nuisance in the vicinity.
- 7. The premises licence holder shall take appropriate measures to ensure that patrons leave the premises in a quiet and orderly fashion.
- 8. The premises licence holder shall ensure that adequate measures are in place to prevent the escape of odours from the premises. This includes odours from food preparation and refuses storage.
- 9. The premises licence holder shall ensure that adequate measures are in place to remove litter or waste arising from their customers and to prevent such litter from accumulating in the immediate vicinity of the premises.

- 10. All staff to be trained in the prevention of underage sales to a level commensurate with their duties. All such training to be updated as necessary, for instance when legislation changes, and should include training on how to deal with difficult customers. The training should be clearly documented, and signed and dated by both the trainer and the member of staff receiving it. Such training logs shall be kept for a minimum of 12 months from the date of each entry. The documentation shall be available for inspection on request by an authorised officer of the licensing authority or a constable.
- 11. An approved proof of age scheme shall be adopted, implemented and advertised within the premises such as 'Challenge 25' whereby an accepted form of photographic identification shall be requested before any alcohol is sold to any person who appears to be under 25 years of age. Acceptable proof of age shall include identification bearing the customers photograph, date of birth and integral holographic mark or security measure. Suitable means of identification would include PASS approved proof of age card, photo-card driving licnece and passport.
