# Clean Streets, Recycling & Environment

Contract and lease for green electricity generation from landfill gas and landfill gas management at Lamby Way	The Council has a requirement under legislation to manage landfill gas from the landfill sites and the contract will manage this requirement on our behalf. This includes the managing of landfill gas following any economical return by generating electricity.  A new contract and lease is required following current landfill gas lease at Lamby way which has been in place since December 1997 (and which was subsequently extended with effect from December 2014).  Heads of Terms have been agreed with Infinis trading as Novera Energy Generation No.2 Limited.  A contract and lease has been drafted and Officers seek approval	Green	Cabinet

The Fleet Replacement of Waste Collection Vehicles	An initial procurement exercise carried out in 2020 and several vehicles were purchased to replace a number of the aged waste collection vehicles originally procured in 2013.  The exercise verified market prices and confirmed the best value approach is to continue with purchasing of vehicles to replace the existing vehicle fleet with the interim hire of increased vehicle numbers required for four day working.  A two-year replacement program is required to deliver bespoke vehicle types aligned with the Councils waste and recycling collection methodology. The anticipated value of the program is £9.7m. Citywide expansion of the separate glass bottles and jars collection service	Cardiff could become one of the world's leading recycling cities if it can increase recycling rates to 70% by 2025. In order to achieve 70% by 2025, the Council will need to recycle an additional 20,000 tonnes of waste material from residential and trade waste.  Recycling performance is a statutory target and Welsh Government are able to request Local Authorities make a financial payment if the Council does not achieve recycling levels by the date set. For Cardiff, this equates to approximately £200 for every tonne of recycling below the statutory target.  There is an improvement in recycling performance by undertaking a separate glass collection due to an improvement in recycling rate from 81.2% to 98.8%. This represents a 1,550Tonnes or 0.9% improvement in recycling performance. This would reduce any potential fine for not achieving statutory targets by £300,000.	Amber		Cabinet

Sustainable Drainage Approval Body (SAB) Adoption and Future Maintenance of Sustainable Drainage (SuDS) Features	Schedule 3 of the Flood and Water Management Act 2010 places a mandatory requirement for the Unitary Authority, acting in its capacity as a SuDS Approval Body, to adopt drainage systems that are constructed in accordance with Welsh Government Standards for Sustainable Drainage and approved proposals.  Since the introduction of the legislation in January 2019, for qualifying developments the two main options for SuDS maintenance are:  • A Management Company that will maintain the SuDS features.
