



trend mirrors exactly the activity during Q4, attrough this quarter in 2014/15. There has been an increase of 6% (532 crimes) compared to the same period in 14/15. There were also an additional 99 crimes reported in Q4 of 15/16 when compared to Q3. During Q4, the overall number of ASB incidences decreased by 11% from 2914 in Q3 down to 2605 in Q4. This also compares favourably to the same quarter last year, with a reduction of 270 overall incidents from Q4 2014/15. In addition, March 2016 registered over 280 fewer ASB incidents than the same month in the previous year.



During Q4, hate crime in Cardiff increased by 19% from the previous guarter and has increased by 14% from the same period in 2014/15.

On a month-by-month basis, the number of hate crimes in Cardiff follows the same trend as in the previous year, with a rise between January and March following on from a steep reduction between November and December.

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Story and context for current trend

South Wales Police have completed a review of Operation Mistletoe activity in 2015. The review noted significant decreases in criminal activity on Christmas Day and Boxing Day with a total decrease in incidents of 4% on the previous year. Although Anti-social Behaviour offences saw a decrease of 10% from the previous year, violent crime increased by 4%. The number of robberies did not perceptibly change.
