Cllr Parkhill: Economy and Culture Scrutiny Committee: reviewed the altered business plan and delivery of central square and bus station a long overdue part of our city's infrastructure. In addition were able to comment on initial plans for a new indoor arena, metro central including the planned renovation of Cardiff central station.

Scrutinised and questioned the new operator of Llanishen Leisure centre, particularly around the staff morale, improved sickness rates and conflicting reports of customer satisfaction surveys.

As Shadow Cabinet responsible for Transport, have spearheaded the group's efforts to alter the transport strategy of the city. This resulted in a green paper setting out the early stages of a transport strategy for the city.

Section 2: Constituency Activity

We hold surgeries three times per month, using a variety of venues around the ward: the newly-opened Llanishen Hyb; Thornhill Community Centre; Llanishen Leisure Centre; St Faith's Church Hall

We undertake regular street visits around the ward, to meet residents on their doorstep and find out about local issues.

We have attended PACT meetings in both Llanishen and Thornhill, working alongside Police to help tackle traffic and parking issues, speeding and Anti-Social Behaviour.

We have dealt with a wide array of casework in our first year. Highlights include: attending planning committees in relation to local planning applications; helping residents secure new bins and improvements to a local park; helping the Llanishen Good Neighbours charity secure a corporate blue badge to help when providing transport to residents; pushing for improvements to bus services; dealing with complaints arising from waste collection; mending potholes; organising a petition calling on the Council to fully resurface Coed Glas Road.

Recent months have seen the roll-out of Virgin fibre optic broadband across Thornhill. We have supported residents with any matters arising from the works needed to accomplish this.

Initiatives and Special Activities

We participated in litter picks as part of the Love Where You Live campaign.

We met representatives from Welsh Water to monitor progress of Llanishen Reservoir

Undertook a waste facilities tour to Lamby Way Materials Recycling Facility, the Council's composting facility, the Kelda Organic Waste Facility and the Viridor incinerator.

Undertook a site visit to the Hydrogen Fuelling Centre in Baglan.

We Signed the Motor Neurone Disease Charter to provide better support of people with MND and their carers.

Other Activities/Issues

Rotary Club Organising Committee for the Llanishen Christmas Lights celebration.

Participated in Llanishen Baptist Church's Revelation youth group fundraising and pantomime productions.

Cllrs Jenkins and Lancaster are PCC members of local churches.
We supported local Scout Group Fundraising initiatives.

Attended charity fundraising performance by a local choir.
Participated in the BBC Street Auction program raising money for charity.

We have attended numerous events such as Thornhill Primary School fete, Bring-and Buy sales; car boot sales at Llanishen High School; Scout Group fireworks display.
