Insert the following bullet points:

- *'recognises that legislation alone is not the answer to improving access to services for those with autism in our communities;'*
- *'believes that services should be delivered on a person-centred and child-centred basis.'*

In the resolution, remove the words *'resolves to'*

First bullet point of the resolution delete all after Social Services and add

*'seeking reassurances that the Welsh Government will continue to consult with key partners; act on the recommendations contained in the recent independent report, 'Evaluation of the Integrated Autism Service (IAS) and the Autism Spectrum Disorder Strategic Action Plan'; and keep open the option for further legislation if necessary;'*

The Motion would read as follows:

This Council:

- notes the recent defeat of the Autism Bill at the National Assembly for Wales, while recognising the progress secured through the National Integrated Autism Service and the Additional Learning Needs and Education Tribunal (Wales) Act;
- recognises that legislation alone is not the answer to improving access to services for those with autism in our communities;
- believes that services should be delivered on a person-centred and child-centred basis.

This Council therefore:

- requests that the Leader of the Council writes to both the First Minister and the Minister for Health and Social Services, seeking reassurances that the Welsh Government will continue to consult with key partners; act on the recommendations contained in the recent independent report, 'Evaluation of the Integrated Autism Service (IAS) and the Autism Spectrum Disorder Strategic Action Plan'; and keep open the option for further legislation if necessary;
- requests that the relevant scrutiny committee of this Council produces a piece of work, in collaboration with relevant stakeholders, on what more this Council can do to support those living with autism in Cardiff.
