Second bullet point insert after relevant 'Cabinet Members work with relevant' and after scrutiny committees delete 'of this Council produce a piece of work' and replace with 'to review'

In third line after in collaboration with delete the word 'relevant' and after stakeholders insert 'the effectiveness of the work of the Integrated Autism Service and make recommendations'

## The Motion would read as follows:

This Council notes the recent defeat of the Autism Bill at the National Assembly for Wales and recognises that legislation is not the only answer to improving access to services for those with autism in our communities.

This Council therefore resolves to:

 Request that the Leader of the Council writes to the Minister for Health and Social Services urging the Welsh Government to bring forward the Code of Practice on the delivery of autism services as soon as possible.  Request that the relevant Cabinet Members work with the relevant scrutiny committees, to review in collaboration with stakeholders, the effectiveness of the work of the Integrated Autism Service and make recommendations on what more this Council can do to support those living with autism in Cardiff.
