## 1. Application

1.1 An application for the Grant of a Premises Licence has been received from Demipower (2017) Ltd in respect of KFC, 112 St Mary Street, Cardiff, CF10 1DX.
1.2 The applicant has applied for the following:
(1) In respect of the following licensable activities:
(i) The provision of late night refreshment (indoors and outdoors)
(2) Description of Premises (as stated by applicant):
"Use of the premises as a fast food outlet where hot food will be sold seven days a week for takeaway purposes, for home delivery and for consumption at the premises"
(3) Unless otherwise indicated the premises may be open to the public during the following hours and for any hours consequential to the non standard timings:

Monday to Sunday: 10:00 to 00:30 hours
(4) To provide licensable activities during the following hours:
a) The provision of late night refreshment (indoors and outdoors):

Monday to Sunday: 23:00 to 00:30 hours
1.3 A site plan of the premises can be found attached as Appendix $\boldsymbol{A}$.
1.4 A location map showing the premises can be found attached as Appendix $\boldsymbol{B}$.

## 2. Promotion of Licensing Objectives.

2.1 The additional conditions proposed by the applicant to meet the licensing objectives are attached to the report and can be found in Appendix C.

## 3. Relevant Representations

3.1 A representation has been received from South Wales Police in respect of this application. A copy of the Police representation can be found in Appendix D. A copy of the response received from the applicant is attached as Appendix $\boldsymbol{E}$.

## 4. Legal Considerations.

4.3 All decisions taken by the Sub-Committee must (a) be within the legal powers of the Council and its Committees; (b) comply with any procedural requirement imposed by law; (c) be undertaken in accordance with the procedural requirements imposed by the Council e.g. standing orders and financial regulations; (d) be fully and properly informed; (e) be properly motivated; (f) be taken having regard to the Council's fiduciary duty to its taxpayers; and (g) be reasonable and proper in all the circumstances.

the CCTV equipment will be maintained in good working order and will continually record when licensable activity takes place and for a period of two hours afterwards. The correct time and date will be generated onto both the recording and the real time image screen. Images from the CCTV may be retained for a period of up to 35 days and may be reviewed by the Licensing Authority.
c) Public safety

- provide exit signage, escape routes and emergency lighting
- train staff in provision of first aid
- install fire alarms and smoke detectors
- provide fire fighting equipment
d) The prevention of public nuisance
keep the music to a reasonable level
- keep the noise coming from customers and equipment to minimum, especially in the evening when local residents are at home
- arrange for all deliveries to be made during normal working hours
- clear litter regularly
- control noxious odours from cooking
e) The protection of children from harm

There is no danger of children harming on the premises as we do not serve alcohol, have gaming machines nor do we provide adult entertainment in any form. All cooking equipment and hot surfaces are beyond customers' reach.

## APPENDIX D (iii)

## POLICE REPRESENTATION

1. A CCTV system shall be installed to an agreed standard as approved by South Wales Police it shall be maintained and operated at all times when the premises are open to the public. The system will cover all areas of the premises where the public have access (excluding toilets) including all entrances and exits any outside area will also be covered. The images will be kept for a minimum period of 31 days. The images will be produced to a police employee, in a readily playable format, immediately upon request when the premises are open to the public and at all other times as soon as reasonably practicable. There will be sufficient trained staff to facilitate the above, all trained staff will be in possession of the current system passwords. Signs will be prominently displayed advising customers that CCTV is in operation at the premises.
2. On Major Event Days a minimum of two SIA (Security Industry Authority) registered door supervisors will be employed at the premises from either 4 p.m. that day but no less than four hours before the commencement of the event, whichever is earlier, until closure of the premises.
3. A minimum of two SIA registered door supervisors will be employed on duty on Friday, Saturday, any Sunday before a Bank Holiday, and New Year's Eve, from 21:00 hours until close, when open to the public beyond 00:00 hrs.
4. When SIA registered door supervisors are employed at the premises they will utilise at least one body worn video device. Any such device will be capable of recording both audio recordings and visual images. The recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and will be produced to a Police employee in a readily playable format immediately upon request when the premises are open and at all other times as soon as reasonably practicable. There will be sufficient trained staff to facilitate the above.
5. The Designated Premises Supervisor shall maintain a duty register of all persons engaged as door and security staff. This register must include the name and SIA number of the person employed, time and date of duty commenced/finished with a signed acknowledgment by that person. The register must include the company employed or through whom the services of that person are engaged. The register shall be kept so that it can be readily inspected by a police employee or authorised officer of the council. The register shall be kept for a period of three years.

## APPENDIX D (iv)

6. An incident record shall be kept at the premises and maintained on site for a period of twelve months. It shall be made available on request to a member of police staff, and will record the following:
a) All crimes reported to the venue
b) Any complaints received
c) Any incidents of disorder
d) Any refusal of the sale of alcohol
e) Any ejections
f) Any visit by a representative of a responsible authority or a member of the emergency services
g) Any failures of the CCTV system
7. Signs will be prominently displayed at exits, requesting that patrons leave the premise and surrounding area in a quiet orderly fashion.
8. Persons under 16 will not be served after 20:00 hours unless accompanied by a responsible adult.
9. At all time when the premises are open to the public the premises shall operate a radio system which is monitored South Wales Police.

Additional evidence to support the notice of the objection will be presented at any subsequent Licensing Committee hearing. This evidence may be expanded on verbally, written, statistical or CCTV evidence.

Thank you for your email.

Our operations team have commented on the police representations as follows:

Representation 1 - Please can the representation be amended so that police viewing is immediately upon request and within 24 hours we would provide a copy in a readily playable format (this is for GDPR reasons);
Representation 3 - Please can the condition be removed. The licence would only allow opening to 00:30, so it seems disproportionate to impose such a condition for the additional 30 minutes' trading. Is it possible to omit the condition and should the police consider the condition reasonably necessary after having monitored the position for a few months, the condition could then be imposed;
Representation 4 - Please can the condition be removed. We are concerned about the GDPR aspect of this mandate. The CCTV coverage of the restaurant should be comprehensive enough to record the area;
Representation 8 - We are a family restaurant, so cannot agree to this provision from 8 pm ;
Representation $9-$ We assume that the radio system is provided by South Wales Police, but please can you confirm.

Please can you confirm whether the above comments can be taken into account and the representations amended as above.
