Please summarise your concerns about this application: I wish to object to this application. I have concerns regarding the application on the grounds that it does not promote the licensing objective of the "Prevention of Public Nuisance" and also that the application is not in line with the Cardiff Council Statement of Licensing specifically in regards to Licensing Hours as set out in 7.3, the Off-Sales of Alcohol and 7.4c Prevention of Public Nuisance. The application seeks to extend the opening hours of the store to 24/7 with the prime aim of selling alcohol in these hours, the current closing time being 2300 hours. It is worth noting at this juncture that the World Health Organisation (WHO) consider the hours between 2300 and 0700, night time. I am particularly concerned about noise Night time noise from 3 aspects. Patrons entering and exiting the premises throughout the night to purchase alcohol and staying within the vicinity, congregating to consume said alcohol whilst creating noise. This will result in disturbing sleep to the residents who live directly above the dwelling, and in the vicinity where almost all other units have residential above their units. Environmental Health Practitioners are unable to deal with noise complaints of people in the street, but receive complaints nonetheless; it should therefore be considered strongly at licensing stage to prevent Public Nuisance occurring; There are no other premises of this kind in the immediate vicinity therefore likely to attract a significant number of people from the surrounding streets. Please give further details of why you believe this application will have an adverse effect on the licensing objectives: In summary, the applicant has not adequately outlined how the above measures would be mitigated and as such failed to demonstrate that they are promoting the licence objective.

Dear Miss Hartrey,

In accordance with the Health Board's role as a responsible authority, I can confirm we have received the following application for a premises license variation for: - 46 Tudor Street, Riverside, Cardiff, CF11 6AJ.

We understand that this premise wishes to extend sales of alcohol to 24 hours. The Cardiff Statement of Licencing Policy recognises the potential negative impact of increased availability of alcohol, stating "Off-licences that open later in the evening, or sell alcohol products attractive to street drinkers, are considered a higher risk of adversely affecting the licensing objectives". (Cardiff Statement of Licencing Policy 2018 - 2021)

This application will increase the availability of alcohol within the Riverside area of Cardiff, and we anticipate it will contribute to a maintenance or likely increase in the number of incidents of anti-social behaviour, nuisance noise, crime and alcohol related hospital admissions. Evidence shows us that:

- Opening hours and density of alcohol sales outlets influence alcohol consumption, drinking patterns and damage due to alcohol¹
- Reducing alcohol availability and access is key to preventing alcohol related problems in the community².
- Research into the patterns of alcohol availability and alcohol related harm over time
 in Wales found that changes leading to the increased availability of alcohol were
 related to an increase in alcohol-related harm, such as excessive alcohol
 consumption, hospital admissions and violent crimes³.

Data from the a report compiled by Cardiff Council into the Night Time Economy showed that between the hours of 18:00 and 06:00 in 2018/19 Riverside, where the premises is based,

had the second highest count of Violence against the Person in the City (appendix 1). The area of Riverside also has higher than average incidences of ASB (appendix 2). Health related dated shows that the premises is located in an area with high alcohol-specific admission rates as compared to the rest of the City (appendix 3).

We therefore wish to make representation under the licencing objectives of Prevention of Public Nuisance, Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety.




Violence against the Person, which occurred between 18:00 and 06:00 hours. The following chart shows the total number of offences which occurred between 2018/19.


Comparison of the percentage of overall ASB incidents 17/18 - 18/19 with each ward accounting against the Cardiff total for the last two years.


