The increase in charges was scheduled to be implemented in 2019 and we cannot justify any further delays to these proposals. The car park in Llandaff Village already has a period of free parking (2 hours), which can be used for dropping off/picking up and for short visits to the area. This has enabled a frequent and successful turnover of parking spaces. A small increase in charges will have no impact on visits of less than 2 hours.
