What is Families First?

One of Welsh Government's 'Tackling Poverty' programmes:

Promotes the development of effective multi-agency early intervention and support for families

First programme 2012/13 – 2016/17

c£5m annually but 11% decrease for 2016-17

New Guidance for programme April 2017







Putting Families First

6 service packages



Early Years – provides a range of support for families with babies or young children (under the age of 8) and for pregnant women. This package is led by Cardiff and Vale University Health Board.



Child & Youth Engagement (Connect 8-25) — makes sure that children and young people do well in school, college or work and get the support they need from their families. This package is led by the City of Cardiff Council's Education Service.



Sustainable Employment – provides help for adults in families who want to get back into work or into better paid jobs. This package is led by Sova.



Healthy Lifestyles – helps families to deal with things like diet, exercise, smoking and sexual health and to live healthy lives. This package is led by Cardiff and Vale University Health Board.



Emotional & Mental Health and Wellbeing (Cadarn) – supports children and young people who are anxious or unhappy. This package is led by Barnardo's.



Disability Focus – provides extra help for families who have a disabled child. This can provide key working as part of the Team Around the Family approach. This package is led by Action for Children.

and a TAF approach:



Cardiff Team around the Family (CTAF) – provides a team of family workers who help to coordinate a Team Around the Family approach for families with more complex needs (i.e. who need four or more services), but who do not pass threshold for social services interventions. This team also deliver the Freephone Service. The service is delivered by Tros Gynnal Plant.



Two main challenges:

- Maintaining delivery in face of reduced funding
- 2. Uncertainty over future:
 - ➤ Sustainable Employment decommissioned during 2016-17
 - ➤ Other packages extended 2017-18 to allow for new arrangements but anxiety of staff



Interpreting the data:

Case studies, photos and quotes but also data from report cards:

- 'Individuals' counted by different projects may be the same individuals
- Numbers recorded for anonymised data lower than those in report cards:
 - > Only new service users report cards existing and new
 - > Only those doing an extended piece of work
- Infographics 'how much' aggregated, 'better off' figures refer only to those in relevant project




Key achievements

- Services recorded delivery to 19,751 children, young people and parents
- 277 families with more complex needs received support from a Team Around their Family
- The working relationship with schools was strengthened - worked with 175 schools across Cardiff
- Young Inspectors All packages achieving against National Participation Standards
- New Disability Index improving information for families with disabled children

Putting Families First in Cardiff

Contribution to Early Help

Using Families First to develop more effective arrangements:

- Stakeholder engagement, including children, young people and families – work with Cardiff University
- TAF team supported pilot of Joint Assessment Family Framework [JAFF]
- Involvement of schools JAFF pilot and schools' working group to develop more consistent arrangements
- Also a clearer Early Help 'Front Door'
- Divert from MASH and 'step down' from Children's Services



Next steps

- Stakeholder Engagement and review have informed plans for recommissioning (agreed by Cabinet in July 2017)
- New relationship between TAF/Freephone service and Children's Services to form basis of early help 'front door': Support4Families@Cardiff
- Plans for in-house delivery of main Parenting and Youth
 Support Services developed with Education Service
- New model of working with schools: Vulnerability Assessment
 Profile and Early Help Family Support Workers
- External tendering for other services ODR end of November
- Disability Focus informed by Disability Futures programme work with Vale of Glamorgan
- Young Commissioners supporting UNICEF Child Friendly City



Communication

- Frequently Asked Questions to inform providers messages checked with Legal and Procurement
- Current Providers to develop exit strategies: either complete delivery or support individual service users who need on-going support to access new
- New programme: clearer service offer
- Working with Family Information Service to improve general information and communication
- Also with TheSprout to keep young people informed
- 'Soft launch' of Support4Families@Cardiff pilot headteacher conferences, Safeguarding events etc
- Helpline service to provide up to date information
