ITEM 8: ANNUAL WELLBEING PLAN

Significant Improvements in Sickness Absence: Sickness absence has been a long-standing area of challenge for the Council, however, significant improvements have been seen over the course of 2020/21. The outturn position for 2020/21 was 8.6 full-time equivalent (FTE) days lost per employee across the Council, below the target of 9.5 days lost per employee. This is an improvement of 3.17 days lost when compared to 2019/20. Short-term sickness absence also continues to fall, with a 48% decrease compared to 2019/20. Furthermore, whilst long-term sickness accounts for 78% of all absences, the number of days lost has decreased by 15,000 days.
