Hundreds of residents in Pentyrch and Rhydlafar remain both angry and frustrated over the decision and apparent lack of interest by the County Council.

Can you please provide a detailed report on what steps were taken, when, and the conclusion reached following the Planning Committee's decision to resolve this transport problem?

Many strong compelling research evidence into racial health inequalities exposed during Covid19 were presented. We also heard about cardiac condition having higher prevalence in certain ethnic minority communities i.e. Bangladeshi community. The presentation stated one way to improve health and reduce risk of these communities is through exercise and Bangladeshi women in particular are least likely to exercise and one main reason for this was 'feeling uncomfortable in mixed gender facilities'. Cardiff piloted and opened 'women only swimming' at its leisure facilities many years ago on the back of such research evidence; these sessions were very popular. However, whilst Covid19 exposed these health inequalities, it also led to significantly reduced 'women only swimming' in the city. Has Cardiff back-tracked on its commitment on addressing health equity?
