Environmental Scrutiny - 16 November 2023 - Nature Emergency & Biodiversity Update

Thank you for the letter dated 29th November outlining the observations from the Environmental Scrutiny Committee meeting held on 16th November 2023 regarding the Nature Emergency and Biodiversity Update. We welcome the observations and comments made following this meeting.

The Committee requested information regarding the number of planning application objections that the County Ecologist has submitted and how many of these were accepted/supported, since he has been in post. The Planning team have advised that they do not retain formal records of numbers of applications where an 'objection' is raised on individual applications by the County Ecologist, though these are considered to have been limited, given the positive and proactive approach adopted by officers on such matters.

The current County Ecologist was appointed in June 2023 and, during the last 10 months, has worked collaboratively with officers, agents, and developers to ensure that developments have no unacceptable impacts on biodiversity and, since recent changes in Welsh Government Policy, seek to achieve a net biodiversity enhancement. This approach means that officers have been able to secure improvements to schemes to address identified issues of concern, and to impose conditions (or legal agreements) requiring appropriate mitigation or compensation to be delivered to ensure development can proceed without causing unacceptable impacts on biodiversity.


Notwithstanding the above, the increasing focus on biodiversity and the nature emergency is such that there will inevitably be times when environmental impacts cannot be mitigated or are not outweighed by other identified benefits. In such cases, officers will seek to support the County Ecologist in resisting inappropriate proposals.
